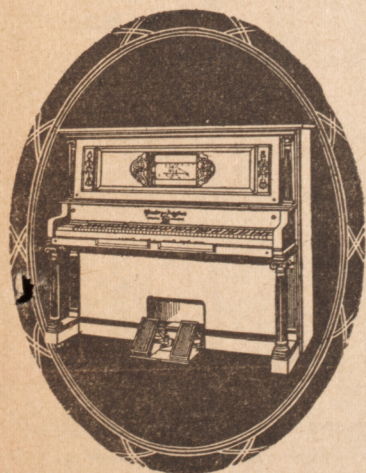

McMURRAY & CO**GET RICH QUICK****MUNRO GOT
THREE YEARS**

New York, March 16.—George H. Munroe, a Canadian, long prominent among promoters of schemes of the "get rich quick" variety, and who is said by government officials to have obtained at least \$500,000 from confiding investors in his propositions during the past few years, was convicted in the United States Circuit Court today of using the mails in connection with fraudulent stock operations and sentenced to serve three years in prison. Munroe formerly operated in Montreal and Toronto.

Chief among the charges for which he was tried was that he promoted through the mails extensive sales of wireless telegraphy stock, the greater part of which was never delivered.

**STRIKE OF MINERS
LOOKED FOR IN WEST**

(Canadian Press)

Winnipeg, Man. March 16.—C. P. R. headquarters has given out the following: Big strike of coal miners is expected in the Crow's Nest District and all through the west. Two years ago they had a strike in Crow's Nest Pass involving all the coal miners there. It was settled through the medium of a board of conciliation and the agreement expires April 1. Negotiations are now under way but it is not expected that a settlement will be reached before April and it is likely that on that date work will be suspended in the coal mines in the Crow's Nest and the Cammore districts. The mines affected have a daily output of approximately 15,000 tons of coal and coke. The number of men affected is three thousand. The points of dispute are wages and the recognition of the open shop. The leading domestic coal mines are the C. P. R. mines at Blinthead, A. R. and I. company's mine at Lethbridge and the Canada West at Taber and many other smaller mines. A struggle of any duration would result in the closing of the smelters in the west Kootenay as they are dependent on the Crow's Nest for coke. It might also affect a few of the smelters in Montana.

**RECIPROCITY IN
ONTARIO HOUSE**

Toronto, Ont., March 16.—The last word on reciprocity, so far as the legislature is concerned, will be heard today. The debate which has continued since last Thursday, reached the final laps shortly before 11 o'clock last night, and this afternoon, following Mr. A. E. Fripp, Hon. A. G. MacKay will address the House. The Liberal leader will move an amendment to Sir Jas. Whitney's anti-reciprocity resolution, deprecating the historical task of annexation and affirming the Opposition's approval of the agreement. He will probably be followed by the prime minister, who will speak briefly.

**INTERNATIONAL PAPER CO.
OPPOSE RECIPROCITY**

(Canada Lumberman)

The International Paper Company have forwarded a protest to the United States Congress against the ratification of the reciprocity agreement. The memorial of protest is in part as follows: "If the proposal regarding paper and pulp in the McCall bill, covering the trade agreement with Canada, is enacted into law, it will without question, paralyze the paper industry and eventually result in the almost complete annihilation in this country of the manufacture of paper made of pulp wood. Here and there may be a mill with exceptional advantages. . . but there is no doubt, that in the main, the industry will go over into Canada, and that a very large number of skilled laborers will have to leave this country to find employment. We regard the so-called 'trade' as being a very costly one for the United States, in so far as it relates to our industry. It is proposed to let in free paper and pulp in exchange for the privilege of getting Canadian wood, but when our mills have gone out of existence in this country, and no longer require Canadian wood, Canada will have the industry and we will have nothing. With a moderate duty on paper, the industry as it exists today, can perfectly well be preserved in this country, and it is in our opinion, a blunder to open our markets to Canadian competition for the sake of getting these restrictions on wood removed. No doubt, in any event, much of the future growth will be in Canada, but that is no reason why the existing industry should be blotted out."
