O'Dell, late of Fredericton, aforesaid, widow, and Elizabeth Ballou, aforesaid, and Ward Chipman Drury of the City of Montreal, Esquire, being Trustees under said will, and said George Burton and Isabella Twining, another of the said legatees aforesaid, by deed bearing date the 22nd day of September, A. D. 1868, registered in York County, Book R.
