



Boston, Mass., Aug. 17—Boston gave a hearty welcome to Admiral Togo today. After exchanging greetings with the city officials this morning the distinguished Japanese naval commander was escorted to the Charlestown navy yard, where he was greeted with a vice admiral's salute of fifteen guns. After taking luncheon with Captain DeWitt Coffman, the commandant of the yard, Admiral Togo inspected the dry dock the machine shops and the several battleships, cruisers and submarine boats now at the yard. After leaving Charlestown the party were taken in automobiles to Quincy for an inspection of the plant of the Fore River Shipbuilding Company. Tonight Admiral Togo dines at the Algonquin Club with Governor Foss and other notables and tomorrow he is expected to visit the Boston public library, the art museum and Harvard University before departing for Buffalo late in the afternoon.

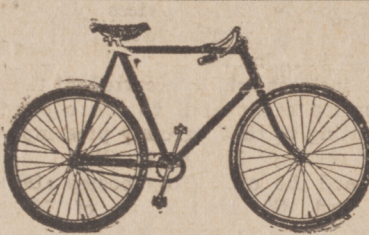
