TALE OF SEA CONTAINED IN CANISTER

Galveston, Texas, Nov. 28.—News of a tragedy in the Gulf of Mexico in August in which an unidentified vessel was wrecked in a storm and the crew or passengers cast into the sea and set face to face with death, was borne into Galveston today on a tiny slip of paper found in a tin box, which was on a piece of wreckage far off the Texas coast. The scribbling was in red and apparently had been done with the rough edge of a tin lid after it had been jabbed into a man's arm. This is the message:

"August 12—Unless help arrives in another day we will be dead from thirst."

There was other writing on the paper, but the salt water sweeping through the beg washed away the characters and the words could not be distinguished. An attempt was made to give to the world the name of the vessel which was lost in the storm and the names of some of those on board, but the water cheated the writer of his purpose.

"Lan" or "San" are the only words in the name of the vessel which can be made out, but search of the records of the shipping offices here failed to tell of the foundering of any steamship or schooner which might answer that description.

The tin box bearing the message of wreck and death was picked up by a man aboard a fishing vessel 200 miles from the coast of Texas. It was wedged in between timbers of what apparently was the side of a cabin, and, even though the words had been obliterated, the story of shipwreck, suffering and death would have been apparent.

There were evidences aboard the raft of the presence of at least three men, and the fishermen declare they must have spent several days drifting about in the Gulf. Pieces of rope were lashed round and about the wreckage, and these afforded safety to the men when high seas dashed over them. There were several other cans of the sort in which the message was found, an old coat and a sailor's cap and traces of hard food.

The wreckage was well out of the path of travel along the southern edge of the Gulf when the fishing schooner came upon it.

habited Scotland at one time. The Celt Saxon, the Danes and Scandinavians settled in the southern and came from Ireland in the fifth century and settled in the north. Soon the tide began to flow from Northern Europe, and the Angles the eastern sections. The east and the West are racially different, the Highlander and the Lowlander representing two distinct types. The Celt in the west has given his martyrs, the east has given many of the great men to the world. It appears that intermarriage is necessary to permanence and greatness. There can be no greater national calamity than to intermarry within one stock. Scotland is a striking testimony to the blending of types. Canada is offering vast opportunity for the blending of original stocks. All artificial barriers are a calamity when time is counted by thousands of years.

INSTRUCTIVE BLENDING

The blending of these diverse races is most instructive. Several factors led to this result. The struggle with England to maintain her independence welded the clans, tribes and sections into a unit.
