FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

MONTREAL WHEAT

Our own market during the last week has not been as active as it was during the previous week owing to a certain extent to temporary scarceness of funds in Montreal. This has not been noticed in any marked extent but there have been slight indications of it in evidence. Shawinigan stock has been a very strong feature selling as high as 124, in anticipation of the earnings which are looked for during the coming year.

Rio Janeiro was rather disappointing and sold off from 117 to 114½ on news of competition and new financing. Dominion Canners stock was another that reacted after selling up as high as 73 on expectations of a 6 per cent. dividend, the directors however, do not meet until the beginning of the new year and if a dividend of 6 per cent. is declared this stock should be worth much more than present prices.

The bull movement in the whole Montreal list was rather overdue for a time and the reaction that has taken place will do a lot towards putting the market in a better position.

There are a lot of industrial stocks which are selling very low and which have not any marked advance since the date of election with the exception of Cement common. Some of these industrial issues are Dominion Textile common, Dominion Iron and Steel common, Canadian Colored Cottons, Canadian Converters and others. As Canadian Industrials will most probably receive protection from the present government, we look for advances in the majority of these issues.

MARKET LETTER

After a slight decline and steadiness during the early part of the week, the market has again taken another advance, the volume of trading has been normal and without principal incident, the principal feature being the strength of Reading and Lehigh Valley issues.

Though it is pointed out by some of the New York critics that the last movement on the bull side of the stock market in July was in the Anthracite Railroad stocks and that for several days in the decline of August and September, Lehigh Valley and Reading were the weakest features and from this they argue that the strength now in these particular stocks indicates a possible culmination of the bull movement, it nevertheless appears that with the greater confidence which has exhibited that higher prices still are likely all through the list and this opinion is borne out to a very great extent by the much better position of the Copper trade, where stocks both in United States and abroad are very low and this augurs well strength in Amalgamated and other copper issues.

CANADIAN PACIFIC

The great deal of interest has been taken in the C. P. R. stock which has advanced strongly during this week's market, various rumors being brought forth to the effect that the \$20,000,000 of treasury stock will soon be placed which would mean a distribution of rights to the shareholders.
