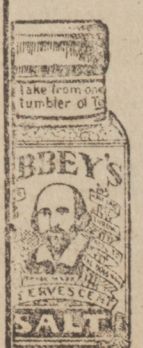

THE STOCK MARKET A LITTLE OFF TODAY

New York, N. Y., Nov. 18—Yesterday's rise in the stock market was all the more convincing for the fact that it made progress against a strong tide of professional short selling and general profit taking and that no attempts were made to sustain prices at their highest levels.

The trend of values appears still to be upwards but it is unlikely that the interests responsible for the rise will try to force matters, preferring to cultivate a short interest and prevent violent fluctuations which would tend to scare the public away. The result of this policy if enforced would be frequent reactions and a good trading market as a consequence. General news as a whole is favorable, especially that relating to the leading lines of steel and copper. The vent of winter weather has also stimulated a fair degree of activity in general merchandise so that the remainder of the year promises to be fairly prosperous from the standpoint of general business. The impending meeting of the New Commerce is robbed of some of its terrors for the consideration that most of the contemplated legislation along radical lines mostly that relating to tariff schedules will meet the presidential check. More over, if there is anything in precedent, very little important legislation is to be expected pending the presidential elections.

HON. SENATOR WOOD TALKS OF GOVERNORSHIP

Montreal, Nov. 18—Senator Josiah Wood of New Brunswick, whose name is the only one mentioned for the next Lieutenant Governorship of his province, was here en route from Ottawa to Boston. Asked as to his filing the gubernatorial position, Senator Wood said that his health had not been of the best during the past two years. He suffered a paralytic stroke last year, but is however, much improved after a period in Europe, which extended from August to October of this year.

Of the changes in the personnel in the international waterways commission which the new government is reported to contemplate, Senator Wood said they were not in effect yet, but that the government certainly owed something to Mr. H. A. Powell.

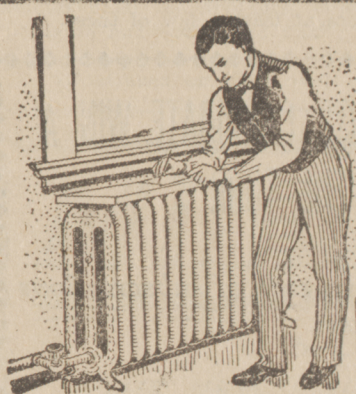

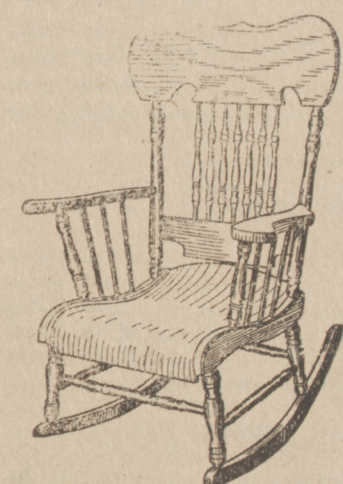
