BORDEN SURRENDERED TO NATIONALISTS

(Toronto Globe)

The first speech from the Throne in the new parliament of Canada is not notable for what it contains but for what it omits. Its silence is far more significant and far more ominous than its speech. There are paragraphs, commonplace enough but passable on a variety of routine topics, but on the question of supreme interest to Canada and to the Empire, the Government's policy on naval defence, there is never a word. Why? Because the Nationalist faction in the Government blocks the way.

The Government is a house divided against itself. On one side are the ultra-Imperialists who wave the Union Jack of Britain; on the other side the anti-Imperialists who, as Hon. Jean Prevost, declared, raise aloft the tri-color of France. The one side committed itself first to a Canadian fleet, then to a contribution of Dreadnoughts and money, and then tried to evade all responsibility by promising a plebiscite. The other side simply will not agree to any proposal that would commit Canada to partnership with Britain in matters of naval defence. Truce on the basis of a plebiscite was formed between these warring parties for campaign purposes. Now the time has come to settle accounts. The Prime Minister is not master of the situation. He dared not announce his own policy or any policy on the navy question in the speech from the Throne which he put into the hands of the new Governor-General yesterday.

And no excuse either from the pressure of parliamentary work or from public indifference or from the lack of urgency in the matter can be offered. The tenders for the construction of the nucleus of a Canadian fleet as approved by the British

ish admiralty and by British naval experts are awaiting the Government's action. Public opinion especially in the loyalist circles of the Government's own supporters, is becoming extremely restive. The Premier's choice of three Nationalists, Messrs. Monk, Pelletier and Nantel, has aroused suspicion, rapidly growing into open protest. That protest is not satisfied by the selection—in surrender to the threat "to raise the lodges"—of Col. Sam Hughes as Minister of Militia. But protest or no protest, it is a humiliating spectacle this weak and compromising situation in which the Government of Canada finds itself. It is afraid to go forward, it dare not go backward and it cannot stand still. And this is what comes to men who talked "No surrender," only a few weeks ago. They have surrendered. The Nationalist minority are in control on the question of Canada's place and part in Imperial defence.

HEARINGS ON WATER POWER

Washington, Nov. 21.—The National Waterways Commission was called to order here today by chairman Senator Burton of Ohio, to hold a series of hearings with a view of obtaining every available information concerning the important subject of water-power. The commission will consider fundamental principles pertaining to rights in and utilization of water-powers; the proper relation of the Federal Government to their development in the public domain or in navigable rivers under the jurisdiction of Congress; the best method of utilizing water-powers as a problem of hydraulic engineering; the most desirable line of division between State and national control, etc. Among those invited to attend the hearings are Attorney General Wickersham, Rifford Pinchot, Secretary Fisher and Louis Brandeis. It is expected that the commission will embody its findings in a voluminous report to Congress.
