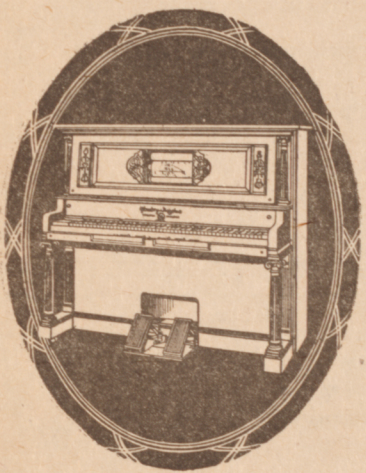

THE REVENUE CONTINUES BUOYANT

Ottawa, Jan. 9.—The financial statement of the Dominion for December, published in The Canada Gazette, is one of the most satisfactory for a very long time.

The revenue for December was \$9,790,387.14, an increase of \$1,856,816.09 while the expenditure for the month was \$5,355,286.13, an increase of \$633,726.36.

For the nine months of the fiscal year ended with the last day of the calendar year, the revenue was \$85,665,833.83, as against \$73,390,080.97, a betterment of \$12,275,752.86.

The expenditure for the nine months shows an increase of \$5,596,903.53, the figures being \$52,994,133.97 for 1910, as against \$47,398,129.54 in 1909.

The expenditure on capital account during December last was \$3,680,305.47, as against \$3,379,370.77, while for the nine months it was \$22,804,245.33 against \$24,026,137.22 in the corresponding period of last year, nearly the whole of the amount being expenditure on the National Transcontinental Railway.

The public debt shows a decrease of \$878,661.99 on the month but it is \$4,601,879.55 more than in December, last.

A FEW MILLIONS LOST IN THE BIG STOCKS

New York, Jan. 9.—Of the total depreciation of \$632,224,000 in 50 Wall street railroad stocks in 1910, 25 of these contributed \$573,240,000, or 40.6 per cent., of the total.

Atchafalpa common declined 23 points, or \$35,210,000 in market valuation; St. Paul common, 35½ points or \$41,158,000; Lackawanna, 100 points or \$30,277,000; Missouri Pacific, 24½ points or \$20,461,000; New York Central, 13½ points or \$31,261,000; Northern Pacific, 29½ points or \$72,510,000; Southern Pacific, 21½ points or \$59,301,000, and Union Pacific common, 34½ points or \$73,871,000.

United States Steel common, in 1910, declined 18½ points, or \$59,978,000, while in 1909 it appreciated 37½ points, or \$188,979,000.

Five copper stocks in 1910 showed a depreciation of \$81,786,000. In 1909 these same stocks advanced \$28,145,000.

Amalgamated in 1910 declined 27½ points or \$44,435,000, and Anaconda 14½ points, or \$16,616,000.

Four industrials, including Amalgamated, Pullman and United States Steel common and preferred, depreciated \$204,588,000.

In 1909 the appreciation in these four stocks was \$263,319,000.

RUSSIAN STEAMER ON SUBMERGED REEF

Libau, Russia, Jan. 9.—The Steamer Russia from New York for this port, piled up on a submerged reef, four miles out from here, yesterday. Her 150 passengers were landed safely.

Throughout the night a cruiser, six tugs and an ice breaker, made futile efforts to float the liner. Three of her holds are full of water.

The Russia belongs to the Russian East Asiatic Steamship Co., and sailed from New York on December 24, for Libau, by way of Newcastle and Shields.

PORTER CHARLTON TO FIGHT EXTRADITION

Trenton, N. J., Jan. 9.—The Habeas Corpus proceedings to prevent the extradition of Porter Charlton to Italy to stand trial for the murder of his wife, Mary Scott Charlton, again came up before Judge Bellstab in the U. S. Circuit Court here today. The Department of State at Washington has honored the request of the Italian government for Charlton's extradition, but the turning over of the young man to the Italian authorities was blocked by Paul Charlton, the prisoner's father, who applied for the writ of Habeas Corpus.
