WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homstead a quarter section of available Dominon land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands York, who fought six rounds in a 12- mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

> Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

> In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted

his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties, contract to be entered into. -Must reside six months in each of
