THE CEMENT DUTY

A pretty family row has been provoked in the Conservative household through the Borden government's cut in the cement duties. The protectionist World of Toronto sees in the government's action a precedent dangerous to tariff stability, while The Brantford Courier, a Conservative journal, is alarmed for Brantford's implement industries. Finance Minister White has chopped the cement duty in two and The Courier is anxious to know where the thing is to end.

"The western demand for a tariff reduction will be no more appeased by this concession on cement," says The Courier, "than would a hungry lion be satisfied with a piece of cracker."

This serious warning is added: "If there is any monkeying with the tariff, something will drop and it will drop on the Conservative party."

There has surely been some "monkeying" with the tariff, so Mr. Borden must look out for reprisals from his own people. This flirtation of his with the free traders of the west, carried on in the anticipation of favors to come from Saskatchewan in the elections in July next, seems to have been a very bad manoeuvre. He has failed to satisfy them and they will demand that other tariff burdens be lifted. On the other hand, the protectionists are up in arms against the government, threatening to turn and rend the premier and his cabinet to pieces. Altogether the government has made a bad botch of the whole business.

A PARTY DODGE

The intentions of the Borden Government as to the tariff cannot be correctly judged until after the Saskatchewan election says the Toronto Star. At present the reduction in the duty on cement bears the appearance of a party dodge, intended to hurt Premier Scott and to help Mr. Rogers. But it is possible that the pressure which caused the reduction of the duty on cement, continuing after the election, may lead to a general revision and reduction of the tariff. If so, the Government will have the hearty co-operation of the Liberal Party.

The tariff however, must be handled in a systematic and courageous way, as it was handled by Mr. Fielding in 1897. Mr. Fielding and his colleagues gave their time and energy to a thorough revision. They faced the responsibility of the British Preference and the other tariff reductions. They laid their plans before the House of Commons to decide.

The present Government has in one case evaded responsibility, by referring a tariff duty to the courts and in another case has deprived the House of Commons of its rightful control over the tariff. Neither way is desirable. That tariff ought to be reduced according to the principles of responsible government, by ministers who will frame the new tariff and submit it to the House of Commons.

Ottawa Journal:—The anger of Archbishop Bruchesi has been incurred by the view of Mr. Langlois that the backward condition which is alleged is due in part to the interference of the clergy with the schools, and to the apathy of the clergy as regards development in anything, which does not seem to tend directly to the supremacy of the church. To argue against this contention of Mr. Langlois by the ban of the church would be surely a serious mistake.

Saskatoon Phoenix:—The "Stay in Ontario" movement is getting exciting. An eastern orator recently implored his audience to "stop boosting the west." It is unfortunate for the east that the west doesn't need boosting. The silent call of potential wealth is what is peopling the west, and the east, for the present at least, must just "grin and bear it."

Ottawa Citizen:—The whole point of the matter is that a marriage celebrated in any portion of the British empire by a person duly authorized by the King's license to perform a marriage ceremony is recognized in every part of the British empire—except Quebec. It is about time that the King's license was recognized in Quebec.

The Republican Convention at Chicago on Saturday renominated Hon. William H. Taft for president and Hon. James S. Sherman for vice president. The nomination was made on the first ballot and over three hundred of the Roosevelt delegates refused to vote. It is said that Roosevelt may head an independent party.

The provincial elections in the province of Saskatchewan will take place on July 11. The Liberal government led by Premier Scott has been in office seven years and has a splendid administrative record. The fight is being waged under the direction of Hon. Robert Rogers, Minister of the Interior.

Congratulations to Mr. Pinder on leading the poll in the York election to the tune of 22 votes. For this honor Mr. Pinder can thank his personal friends at Temperance Vale, who struck the Provincial Secretary's name from their ballots.

The election in the county of Gloucester which was deferred to meet the convenience of the fishermen is taking place today. A determined effort is being made to capture the county for the Flemming government and may be successful.

Vancouver Province:—With the parliament buildings at Ottawa heated by Canadian coal, supplemented by the hot air in the Commons Chamber, the temperature is exclusively regulated by material "made in Canada."

The Tory Candidates in York got so many votes in the late election that Sheriff Howe found it necessary to employ an adding machine in order to make up the totals.

Although knifed by Mr. McLeod's benchmen at various places Mr. Pinder had the honor of leading the poll in the recent election. This was certainly a great triumph for the old gentleman.

REV. T. D. BELL NOT ASKED TO RESIGN

Rev. T. D. Bell of Rusiagornish has requested the Mail to publish the following:

"Whereas the Fredericton Gleaner has in its daily issue of the 19th inst., and in its semi-weekly issue of the 21st inst. stated that 'The resignation of Rev. T. D. Bell, has been demanded, Pastor became too active in Politics, and that led congregation to take action in his case, and Whereas, Rev. T. D. Bell is also referred to as being in charge of the Lincoln, Waasis, Rusiagornish and Nasonworth Churches.

Therefore Resolved that the undersigned is authorized to state on our behalf as congregation, That no such demand has been made upon Rev. Mr. Bell.

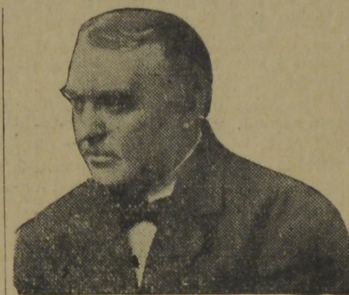

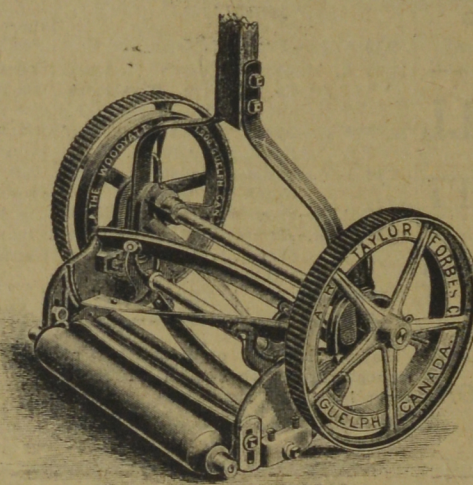

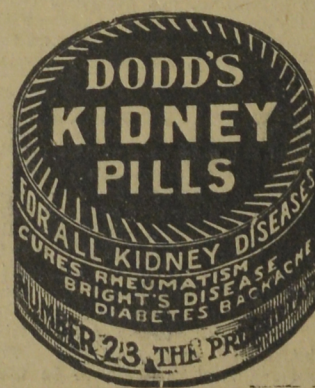
