It was a splendid exhipition of almost perfect fruit, and was a revelation to the people, showing as it did what scientific cultivat on will accomplish and what the climate and soil of New Brunswick can

"There were displayed all the leading varieties of apples, perfect in texture, flavor and coloring, including the McIntosh Red, Fameuse, Dudley Winter, Wealthy, Wolfe River, Alexander, Bethel, Bishop Pippen, Golden Russet, King of Tompkins, Ben Davis, Northern Spy, Stark, Talman Sweet, Wagner Gano, Baxter Gravenstein, Blenheim Pippens, Grimes, Golden Ontario, Fallowater, Salome, Baldwin, Canada Baldwin, Blue Pearmain, Scott Winter, and St. Lawrence.

"There were sixty barrels, 650 boxes and 1,422 plates, attractively and artistically arranged. The provincial department of agriculture exhibited 448 boxes




