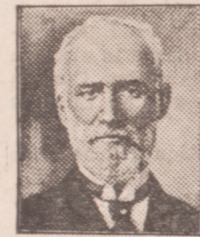

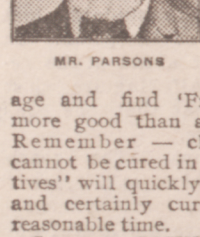

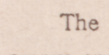

#### RETIREMENT OF ADMIRAL HACHER

Washington, D. C., Sept. 21—By operation of the age limit law Rear Admiral Giles B. Harbar will be placed on the retired list of the navy tomorrow. Admiral Harbar comes from Ohio and was appointed to the naval academy soon after the close of the civil war. He commanded the Jeanette search expedition to the Arctic in the early eighties and was on the battleship Texas in the war with Spain. He was naval attaché at St. Petersburg and Paris for several years. In the famous world cruise of the Atlantic fleet he commanded the battleship Maine and latter he was placed in command of the Asiatic station.
