## CANADIAN ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Montreal, Sept. 22.—If number and high class of entries count for anything, then some record breaking performance may be looked for at the 28th annual track and field championships of the Canadian A. A. U., which are to take place in Montreal tomorrow afternoon. The cream of the Dominion athletes are entered in the various events, and an international flavor will be given the meeting by the participation of a number of star performers of New York and New England.

The championship events will include the following:—100 yards, 220 yards, 440 yards, 880 yards, mile five miles, 3 mile walk, pole vault, running high jump, broad jump, hop, skip and jump, 56-pound hammer throw, 56-pounds weight throw for distance, putting the 16-pound shot throwing and the 120 yards hurdles.

## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 40 acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.


