

Papers found n Swann's possession show that he was a member of British Artillery enlisting from Kirkspok, Eng., and that after repeated mention for bravery in the despatches to the home government, he was awarded the Vic toria Cross. A police circular print ed in Johannesburg, also found among Swann's effects, gives a description of a man wanted for murder and offers \$1,000 for his arrest.
