## KNEW PREMIERS OF LONG AGO

London, June 29—Few men of today know a greater field of interesting political statistics of English public life than Sir Francis S. Russell, who today celebrated his eighty-fifth birthday. Sir Francis entered parliament in 1863, when Palmerston was premier and he enjoyed a more or less intimate acquaintance with the Earl of Derby, Lord John Russell, William Gladstone, Lord Beaconsfield and their successors in the premiership. Acting on his belief that the man who stays too long in public life makes a mistake, Sir Francis resigned his seat from parliament several years ago. He declares that Gladstone and Gladstone would have had they not stayed too long in parliament.
