

WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homstead a quarter section of available Dominon land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his home stead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn nomestead patent) and cultivate fifty

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot ob tain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain dis tricts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivato est erect a house worth \$300.00.
