## SAW MAN THROWN FROM A STEAMER

Tacoma, Wash., Aug. 10.—Capt. E. McMullin, of the British tug *Bermula*, which arrived here today from Texas Island, B.C., reported that Tuesday evening in the vicinity of Active Pass, in the Straits of Juan de Fuca, he saw a man thrown overboard from a tramp steamer flying a foreign flag which was passing out to sea from Victoria or Vancouver. "I was looking at the vessel through the binoculars," said Capt. McMullin, "when I observed a commotion on the forward deck and from the struggling mass of sailors a man was seen hoisted over the bulwarks with a rope around his neck. He was lowered to within a few feet of the water and then the rope was cut."

The detectives, who are employed by the district attorney's office, are having success in locating those who are wanted, as are the other detectives. One young woman alone served 62 subpoenas in San Francisco and vicinity where, it is said, the men could find none of the persons wanted.
