The Colombia congress has unanimously voted a credit of \$2,500,000 of gold, to fortify Tumaco, a port in the southwest part of the republic, and Buen Aventura, and for the purchase of arms, and ammunition. The government is also reported to be raising money through out the country by subscription for the purpose of aiding the preparations for war.

THE VALUE OF SMALL SAVINGS

If he died before he was 60 all that he had paid in with three per cent compound interest would be refunded to his heirs, and if he died just before his first installment Annuity fell due his heirs would inherit \$771.70. A postcard sent to the Superintendent of Canadian Government Annuities, Ottawa, giving your age last birthday, will secure you information as to what an Annuity will cost.

REVOLUTIONISTS ARE MAKING FURTHER GAINS

Shanghai, Oct. 23.—The government has sent \$1,000,000 for deposit in the native banks, which has materially helped the financial situation.

Shanghai, Oct. 23.—The occupation by revolutionists of two more important southern cities, Chang Sha and Nan Chang, was announced in despatches which reached this city early today. Chang Sha is the capital of the Province of Hunan and Nan Chang is in the Province of Kiangsi.

Their capture, therefore, delivers into revolutionary hands the local governments of two important provinces, thereby more than doubling the territory in which the rebels are masters. Shanghai is a city of 300,000 population and is the chief commercial centre on the railroad between Hankow and Canton. It is 200 miles southwest of Hankow, while Nan Chang, a city of 100,000, is correspondingly situated 200 miles southeast of Hankow. The fall of Chang Sha and Nan Chang had been rumored here for a day or two, today's advices definitely confirming that both cities are entirely in the hands of the revolutionists. Four of China's eighteen provinces are now regarded as under revolutionary influence. Sze Chuen, where the movement started, Hu Hsi, of which Wu Chant is the capital, Hunan and Kiangsi. The fall of Nanking, where the garrison is regarded as siding with the revolutionists, would deliver to them the vice-royal government of three more provinces, Kiang Su, Kiang Si and Ngan Hwei. The entire Yang Tse Valley is gradually succumbing to the revolutionary infection. No uprising has been reported at Nanking, which is only 400 miles above Shanghai, but there is every reason to believe that the garrison there cannot be relied upon by the imperial government. Nanking is not only a
