St. Edward Street.

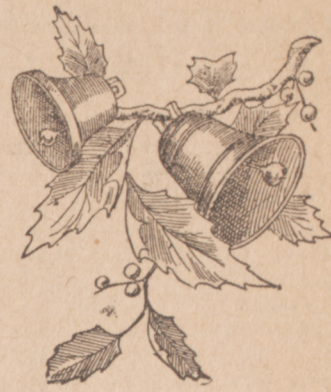

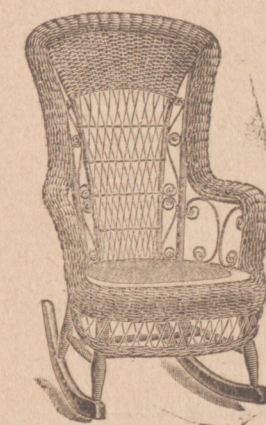
