BATHURST YOUNG MAN KILLED IN MILL

Campbellton, N. B., Nov. 8.—A fatal accident occurred this afternoon at the Shives Lumber Company's Atwood mills, whereby Alphonse Picot, of Bathurst, aged 26, lost his life.

Picot was working at an edger and a piece of scantling flying off the log he was cutting, struck him on the breast, killing him almost instantly.

The coroner, Dr. Martin, held an inquest this evening, when the jury returned a verdict of "accidental death," attaching no blame to the Shives Company.

A brother of the unfortunate man, who is also an employee at the mills, removed the body to Bathurst today for interment. The deceased was highly respected by his fellow workmen and genuine sorrow is expressed over his untimely death.



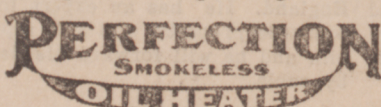
