Tilbury, Ont., Nov. 6.-Hog cholera nas broken out in Tilbury, north township, and active measures have been taken to stamp out the dreaded disease. A number of herds have been slaughtered by instructions of Dominion Inspector Rowe of Blemheim, and the infected farms have been strictly quarantined.
