ATLANTIC WATERWAYS CONFERENCE

Richmond, Va., Oct. 17—Several hundred delegates, representing nearly every Atlantic coast State, assembled in Richmond today for the opening of the fourth annual convention of the Atlantic Deep Waterways Association. The aim of the gathering, which will continue its sessions three days, is to promote the construction, as a national enterprise, of a chain of canals connecting natural and protected waterways along the Atlantic coast, thereby forming a continuous inner navigation route from Boston to Key West. President J. Hampson Moore of Philadelphia is presiding over the sessions. Governor Woodrow Wilson of New Jersey is scheduled as the chief speaker.

RAILWAY BRIDGE BUILDERS MEET

St. Louis, Oct. 17—The twenty-first annual meeting of the American Railway Bridge and Building Association opened here today with a large number of members, representing railroads in all parts of the United States and Canada in attendance. Among the subjects to be considered and discussed during the three days of the session will be "Buildings and platforms for small towns," "Best methods of fireproofing frame and trestle bridges," and "Feasibility of using Brick Veneer for Station Buildings."

INDIANA RED MEN IN SESSION

Indianapolis, Oct. 17—The Indiana Great Council of Red Men opened its annual session here today at Tomlinson Hall, with a large attendance of delegates representing the lodges in nearly all sections of the State. One of the most important questions which will come up for consideration during the two days of the session will be the proposed erection of a State headquarters building of the order in this city.

C. P. R. STEAMSHIP ON THE ROCKS

Victoria B.C. Oct. 16—The Canadian Pacific steamship Princess Beatrice running between Vancouver, Prince Rupert and the northern canneries, which struck on Noble Island last night, was fast on the rocks early today. Three hundred passengers two hundred of whom were Chinese being brought south from the canneries were taken off by the steamship Venture and landed at Alert Bay. No one was injured.

Large holes were stove in the bow and her forward hold filled with water.

When the vessel struck the passengers were taken into small boats and transferred without mishap to the venture.
