States St. John River S. S. Co. did not Receive Fair Treatment from City Council---Refuses Point Ludger Cote's Backache had developed into Blank to Change Dates of Sailing of Steamer---His Company will Fight Crystal Stream S. S. Co. in Courts

Dr. L. A. Currey, manager and president of the St. John River S. Company, Ltd., has written the folowing letter in reply to one of Mr. S. Campbell, secretary of the Fredericton Board of Trade, calling nis attention to the inconvenience caused by both steamers on the St. ohn-Fredericton route leaving and arriving on the same days. Dr. Curey's announcement is of interest to the people of Fredericton and lower St. John Valley and indicates proonged litigation between the St. Steam S. S. Co.

Dear Sirs:-Yours of the 23rd nst., re steamboat service, duly re-

eived and contents noted. Four years ago the late Star Line teamship Company took the "Maestic" off the Fredericton route and ut her on the lower end of the river n opposition to the "Elaine," leavng only a tri-weekly service between St. John and Fredericton. At the invitation and solicitation of the Fredericton City Council, the Fredericton Board of Trade and the people along the river, the "Elaine" was placed on the St. John-Fredericton route on the alternate days with the S. S Victoria," and was so continued un il the present year.

AGREEMENT MADE.

The Star Line went into liquidation and its assets were offered by the curator for sale at public auction Mr. D. J. Purdy purchased at said auction the S.S. "Majestic," company purchased the Star Line wharves at Fredericton and no sale toria" at that time. The day of the sale and shortly thereafter Mr. Purdy came to my office and entered into an agreement whereby he would offer no opposition to us on the St. John-Pho e Fredericton route or interfere with our wharf terminals and we were to offer no opposition to him on the ne city wharves nor would they give of the church. from the Dominion government (which minister. we never received) for carrying mails and in order to give a daily service our company purchased the S.
