LIEUT. GENERAL LAURIE DEAD IN ENGLAND

(Canadian Press.)

London, May 21—The death of Lieut. General John Wimburn Laurie, honorary colonel of the Royal Munster Fusiliers and 63rd Halifax Rifles of Canada, occurred yesterday after a long illness in his seventy-seventh year.

Lieut. General J. Wimburn Laurie spent many years of his life in Canada and will be well remembered in military and political circles. He was before coming to Canada an officer in the Imperial army and served with distinction in the Crimean War and Indian Mutiny. He was also a Fenian Raid veteran and served in the Northwest Rebellion. For some years after his retirement from the Imperial army he commanded the 63rd Halifax Rifles. He took an active part in politics and in 1887 was elected to the House of Commons for Shelburne, N.S., as a Conservative. He retired in 1891 and removed to England, where he has since resided.

Atlantic City, May 20—The National Association of Piano Merchants began its eleventh annual convention in Atlantic City today with prominent representatives of the trade in attendance from every part of the country. Field of St. Louis and Secretary C. A. Putnam of Boston.

NEW WAGE AGREEMENT.

Wilkesbarre, Pa., May 17—Leaders of the opposition to the ratification of the tentative agreement between the miners and operators are expected to take the floor in the Anthracite Miners' Convention today and try to counteract the effect of the strong speeches made yesterday by John D. White, international president and John T. Dempsey and John Fahy, district president of the union who favor the proposed new wage agreement.

It is said that a number of delegates in this sect on where there is much dissatisfaction with the tentative agreement are endeavoring to have their local unions reconsider their instructing them against the proposition and are to have locals authorize them cast their ballots for the agreement.

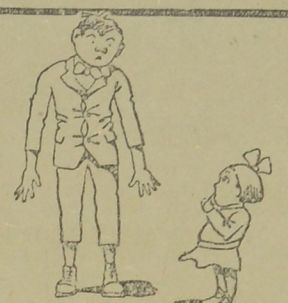
