## FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

### CRITICISMS FROM LONDON

London, Nov. 11.—The Canadian Gazette in discussing the present position of stocks of Canada, says that in Canadian securities some of the movements have been decidedly in favor of the holders, and the general experience has been favorable. One or two new Canadian issues are in contemplation, that of the Alberta Land Company having already made its appearance.

As regards prices, Dominion 3½ per cents are 1 up, and Quebec Province 4 per cents are 1 up. The report of the Grand Trunk Company excited little comment, favorable or otherwise, and on the week the ordinary was lost ¼ and the third preference 1. 800 common and preferred continue to find support, and the price of the former has risen 4, and of the latter 7. Canadian Northern perpetual debenture stock, and ditto, (Quebec) have risen 1, as has also Dominion Atlantic second debenture stock.

In the land shares there is no special feature, the market having been extremely quiet. In Power companies the chief movement is a rise of 8 points on Montreal Light, Heat and Power, while Shawinigan has risen 2.

In the industrial section, Canadian Cement ordinary and preference, continue to find a movement of 1½ in the upward direction having to be recorded in both issues, and Canadian Car preference have risen 2, although Lake Superior iron bonds are to that extent weaker.

### MUCH GRAIN UNDER THE SNOW

Winnipeg, Nov. 11.—It is estimated by western grain men that fully forty million bushels of unthreshed grain in Western Canada lies under several inches of snow which has fallen this week.

Winter has set in in earnest, the temperature being twenty degrees below zero at Calgary yesterday morning and zero at Winnipeg.

### ANOTHER CO. AFTER HYDRO ELECTRIC

Toronto, Nov. 11.—If the citizens of Toronto do not secure cheap light and power, it will not be through lack of distributing agencies anxious to serve them. The Interurban Electric Company of West Toronto, proposes to extend its system and bid for city patronage both in the west

and north. "We believe we can give a better and cheaper service than either of our competitors," said Chief Engineer Thomas Henry. Nevertheless it is the Hydro-Electric that the Interurban is "after." In a circular letter the company attacks on the service and price of the Hydro Electric, and characterizes the adoption by the city of the twenty-five cycle hydro electric current for lighting as a "stupendous blunder."

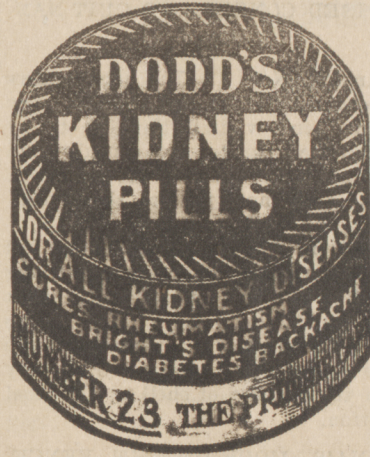
