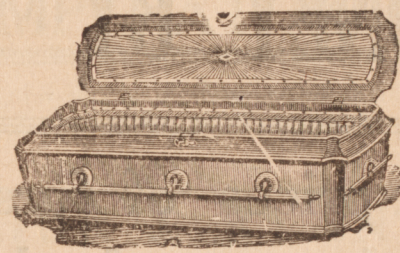

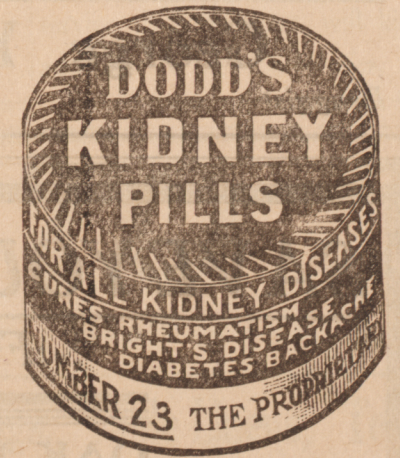

Your Committee advise that the sum of \$1,600.00 be assessed for Parish indebtedness, according to the balances due by Parishes on the 30th of November, 1910, to provide the sum necessary to meet Debentures falling due in August, 1911 (in addition to any other assessment for Parish indebtedness.)

Coun. Sterling said that it was a pleasing fact that there was not an item in this report for interest on debentures, also that the warrant called for an amount less than any year since 1905.

On request Secretary Treasurer Bliss explained the claim of Marysville at length.

On the motion of Coun. S. Keene, seconded by Coun. Green, the report was received and adopted.

A hearty vote of thanks was extended to Coun. Timmins for his work in connection with the report.

In reply Coun. Timmins stated that Ald. Pickard of Marysville had with himself, gone carefully into the matter. Ald. Pickard had not signed the report on account of disinclination to take the responsibility.

On request Councillors Green and Skeene of McAdam were excused from further attendance at the present session of the council.

On the motion of Coun. Timmins, seconded by Coun. Colter, a vote of thanks was extended to Secretary Treasurer Bliss for his labors in connection with the report.

THE RIVER SERVICE.

Globe:—There is considerable speculation as to the future of the Star Line Steamship Company, as the result of the present liquidation proceedings, and several rumors are afloat. It is understood that a number of the largest stockholders have been discussing the plan of submitting to an assessment in order to raise funds to pay off the debt, but this is hardly likely to be carried out owing to differences of opinion which exist between some of the stockholders. It is considered more probable that the proceedings will be allowed to continue, and the assets of the line, including the steamers, will be disposed of by auction. In this event there may be an effort on the part of some of the other lines to buy up the boats for the purpose of effecting an amalgamation.

PREDICTS GREAT FUTURE FOR CANADIAN PACIFIC

Financial Editor, Montreal Star:

Sir,—When I was visiting Montreal in October last, I was interviewed by the Star and was asked my opinion regarding certain railroad properties. I dwelt particularly, at that time, upon the possibilities of the Canadian Pacific—possibilities, that I told The Star spelt potentialities. I predicted that those who would buy and carry the shares would eventually see them sell at 300.

I was modest in my forecast, because if conditions go as they are merrily progressing, the stock, in my judgment, will sell at almost prohibitive figures.

As I pointed out, nearly three months ago, the earnings of C. P. R. were equal to anywhere from 16 to 20 p. c. on the stock, and I said: "Think what the company will earn when Canada has 12,000,000 people."

If reciprocity negotiations are successfully carried through (and why should not wheat and cattle be put upon the free list?) then the value of the 12,000,000 acres of land held by the Canadian Pacific would become if not priceless, at least enormously valuable.

As I said before, and now repeat, with all emphasis, there is no railroad company in North America that has such glowing qualities as C. P. R. possesses. Here, in the United States, we have learned to know what appreciation in value means. In a scant few years, Delaware, Lackawanna & Western, for instance, has risen from \$150 to \$600 a share, and is even today considered by investors to be not only meritorious, but a cheap proposition, but I think that when it comes down to a question of intrinsic worth and bed rock bottom prices, C. P. R. has everything in its favor, and will one day sell just as high as Lackawanna today is marketable for.

WILL DOUBLE TRACK PART OF WESTERN LINE

Montreal, Que., Jan. 18.—That the Canadian Pacific Railway intends double tracking 100 miles of its western system as well as laying over 300 miles of new track in different parts of the prairie provinces, strengthening existing bridges and building many new ones, was the announcement made this morning by vice President Wm. Whyte, of the C. P. R. According to Mr. Whyte the double tracking is to be laid between Port Arthur and Fort William. New railway yards will be constructed at Regina, Moosejaw and Medicine Hat and three new steel bridges will be built one east and two west of Calgary over the Bow River as well as another one across the Elbow east of the Calgary yards.

The line at Moosejaw will be double tracked seven miles east and sixteen and a half west of that city

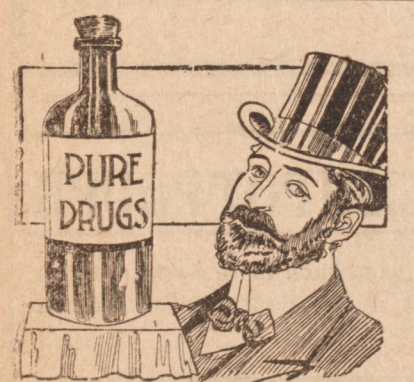
