## VETERAN DRIVER DEAD AT OTTAWA

Ottawa, Ont., July 14.—One of the oldest engine drivers on the Canadian Pacific Railway, Christopher Henry died here last night. He ran some of the earliest trains in Canada.

### PENN TABLET UNVEILED

London, July 13.—In the church of Allhallows Barking, in which William Penn was baptized on October 23, 1644, a bronze tablet in memory of the founder of Pennsylvania, presented to the church by the Pennsylvania Society of New York City, was today unveiled with appropriate ceremonies. The unveiling ceremonies took place before a distinguished assemblage of Englishmen and Americans. Dr. Robinson, vicar of the church, presided and Ambassador Whitelaw Reid delivered the principal address.

The tablet was designed by a firm of New York architects. The expense attendant upon casting and erecting the tablet in the church was borne largely by former Senator W. A. Clark of Montana, who is vice-president of the Pennsylvania Society. The church of Allhallows Barking is the only building still extant in London which is definitely associated with the birth of William Penn.

### ADMIRAL COMLY RETIRED

Washington, D. C., July 13.—After forty-five years of honorable service, filled with adventure and interesting experiences in many parts of the world, Rear Admiral Samuel P. Comly was placed on the retired list of the navy today on account of age. Admiral Comly is a native of New Jersey and entered the Annapolis academy from that State in 1865. Early in his career he accompanied the famous Jurata expedition to the Arctic. During the war with Spain he was an officer on the battleship Indiana and participated in the naval battle of Santiago. His last duty was as commandant of the navy yard at Philadelphia.
