## REV. FATHER CARNEY VS. REV. J. H. McDONALD

(Continued from page seven.)

to cite no authority for his contention beyond his own bare assertions, while I was able to show conclusively, from the original marriage certificate, that Murray was a Presbyterian. The Ne Temere decree has no application to a marriage when both parties are Protestants. Defeat No. 7.

(2) This case has never been dignified with a name. It will be remembered, however, it was cited by Rev. J. H. MacDonald in his very first letter and constituted his second case which he claimed to come from Fredericton. The woman in question with her children, came from the United States and 'twas clearly shown that her marriage had taken place almost four years before the existence of the Ne Temere decree. Defeat No. 8.

(3) The McCann Case—This case, as is well remembered, comes to us from Ireland. I think I showed very clearly by the many unbiased witnesses I was able to call that this case was manufactured purposely for political effect. It is true that Dr. MacDonald was able to call some few witnesses in support of his contention but I claim the preponderance of testimony was on my side. Defeat No. 9.

(4 & 5) In the cases of Mr. Michael J. Payne and Mr. Rowland Roberts, both of Ontario, Dr. MacDonald himself admitted that the Ne Temere decree did not apply because both of these marriages had taken place a number of years ago. Defeats No. 10 & 11.

(6) Wilkinson and Pushie Cases—This case, which comes from Nova Scotia, is similar to the two mentioned above from Ontario, and it falls to the ground in virtue of similar argument. Defeat No. 12.

(7) The Van Buren Case—As this case has been explained in this letter today it calls for no comment here. Defeat No. 13.

### REV. DR. McDONALD'S OBLIGATION.

The argument made by Rev. Dr. MacDonald in his sermon on the last Sunday in May, was based on the assumption that many homes had been wrecked through the operation of the Ne Temere decree. Ample opportunity has been given him to substantiate his charge, but in all that time he has not been able to produce one single case in support of his contention. Therefore, it is very evident that Dr. MacDonald gad not the slightest foundation for his assertion. He deceived his congregation and, not satisfied with that, he endeavored to deceive the public by the publication of a synopsis of his remarks. He has been defeated in public debate and his plain duty is to offer a public apology.

In conclusion, Mr. Editor, it becomes my pleasing duty to thank the public at large who gave me throughout the whole course of this controversy such a kind hearing. I appreciate their disinterestedness and intelligent treatment of me who perhaps, at times tried their patience to the limit. I hope I have given no offence to anyone who took the trouble to read my letters. All through I endeavored to show the public that consideration which I felt they deserved.

For you, Mr. Editor, my thanks are very warm and sincere. You have held the balance faithfully between Rev. Dr. MacDonald and me, and I assure you I feel myself under a deep debt of gratitude to you.

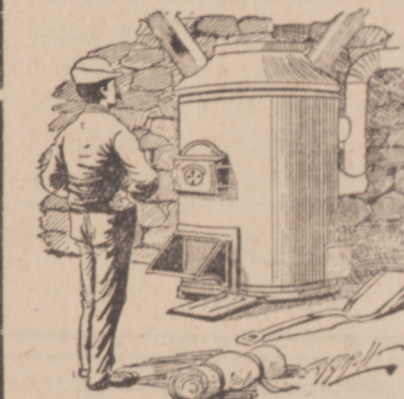
