## MARYSVILLE WON FROM FREDERICTON 6 TO 4 IN OVERTIME

Winners Were Able to Last Better Than Fredericton--Game Fast in Spots and Rough--Machum Forced to Retire--St. John Holds Championship.

Marysville beat Fredericton 6 to 4 at the Arctic Rink last night in the final game of the N.B.H.L. Fredericton was leading 3 to 2 at half time. At the end of time the score was 4 to 4. In the first ten minutes of overtime, Marysville tallied twice. The result of the game is that St. John holds the New Brunswick championship and Fredericton, Marysville and Sussex are tied for second place, with a standing of .500, having won all their home games and lost all their foreign games. The game played last night was the third which Marysville and Fredericton have played this season. The two teams have made an even break. Each has won a game and one resulted in a tie. Each team scored ten goals on the other.

### CONDITION WON.

The superior condition of the Marysville players was one great cause of the Crescents' victory. The ice showed signs of getting soft early in the game and in the second half was cut up and covered with slush. In overtime the surface was so wet and sticky that the puck would hardly be carried and the players found it difficult to skate. Marysville last night better than did Fredericton however. Sterling and Duncan were penalized in the overtime and Fredericton played for some time with only four men on the ice, Marysville having dropped a man when Machum retired.

Marysville played Carl Hovey and Wade, two of their juniors. They were able to deliver the goods, however. Dennison and Bird also played in good style. Hovey at point and Robertson were not as good as they have been.

Fredericton's forwards played in good style the first half when Marysville, except at the first of the period, was outplayed. Fred McLean skated fast and was very effective, but at times, particularly when one or more of his team-mates were off the ice, failed to use his head. Duncan, although playing on his wrong wing, was right in the game while he could stand the pace, but showed lack of condition. Galloway was off color as far as shooting was concerned, but played a good combination. Machum the U.N.B. player, held down Rowan's wing, and played in a way that drew a lot of attention from the Marysville men. He was hurt several times and finally retired in the second half. On one occasion he ran through the Marysville team and would have scored if it had not been for the foul tactics of Marysville, who saved the score without the referee noticing how it was done. Walker at cover point, played the men too much and on that account spent a lot of time with the timers. His rushes were strong but at times he forgot that he was not a forward. At point Archie Sterling played about the best game he ever put up. In the net, "Tart" Titus had an off night. He made some good stops but some easy shots got by.

MARYSVILLE SCORED FIRST  
The game began with Marysville aggressive. Walker rushed and shot but Inch saved.

Play went to the Fredericton end and back again. Marysville kept Fredericton's defence busy until Bird scored when the disc came out of a mix-up in front of the Fredericton net.

Marysville again got a hustle on and took the rubber to the Fredericton end. Machum was hurt and there was a short halt. Machum got the rubber and passed to centre ice where Wade got it and slapped it in.

### SCORE TIED

From the face-off Fredericton went through the Crescents and Galloway scored in 15 seconds.

pressed Crescents hard. Inch stopped two or three hard shots. Marysville could not get the disc out. Fred McLean finally tied the score and the Fredericton crowd cheered.

Hovey tripped Duncan and got three minutes. Dennison got the same shortly afterward. Fredericton's forwards were playing a hard game but lost many chances to score.

Play got fast. Walker was put off for tripping. Fredericton was on the defensive, but worked hard. McLean finally got away. Sterling and Galloway followed and the third took the rubber down to the Marysville net when Sterling scored Fredericton's third goal. The play was the best of the game. Half time was called soon afterward.

### SECOND HALF

The second half started fast. Fredericton kept the play at the Marysville end for a while. It went to the other end. Titus made a couple of good stops. Robertson finally scored in 3 minutes.

Marysville bucked up and Wade scored another goal on a pass from Dennison two minutes later.

Walker tripped Robertson and went off for three minutes.

FREDERICTON TIES AGAIN  
Marysville was in the lead 4 to 3 and the Red and White worked hard to tie. Archie Sterling, who was playing a star game at point rushed the rubber to the Marysville end and Galloway scored on his pass. The rest of the game was close with neither team able to score although both had chances.

Overtime  
Time was called with the score tied and it was decided to play ten minute periods until the tie was broken. Marysville scored twice in the first overtime period and won. Fredericton was unable to stand the pace and the penalizing of Walker and Duncan helped Marysville. After Marysville scored Fredericton was unable to take the offensive.

## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.


ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, the applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties--Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties--Must reside upon the homestead pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties--Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
