INTERNATIONAL DAIRY SHOW OPENED

Milwaukee, Wis., Oct. 10—The International Dairy Show, the second of its kind held in this city was opened today at the big Auditorium in a formal manner by Secretary of Agriculture Wilson. The exhibition, which will continue until Wednesday of next week, is by far the greatest and most important ever held in the West. More than one thousand heads of cattle, representing nearly every known breed, are exhibited on this occasion and practically every section of the United States, as well as Canada and several countries of Europe and of South America have contributed to this big and instructive exhibition. Among the most interesting features are model plants of dairies, butter and cheese factories, etc., all under the strict supervision of government experts selected by the Department of Agriculture. Among the prize animals exhibited are some of the most famous milk cows of the world, among them Pauline Wayne, the pride of the White House stables.

TROUBLE AHEAD
FOR PREMIER BORDEN

Toronto, Oct. 9—With the church courts of every denominational body of protestantism pledged to resist the Ne Temere Decree, a powerful movement to influence the federal government was inaugurated Saturday afternoon by the Evangelical Alliance of Canada at a meeting held in this city. There were present representatives of every denominational section, Anglican, Methodist, Presbyterian, Baptist, Congregational. After a spirited discussion the alliance decided to send immediately to ten thousand clergymen and editors in Canada, a document setting out the alleged conflict of the Ne Temere Decree, with Canadian Civil Rights. Public educational meetings will be held in every centre of Canada. A series of monster petitions will be organized from all protestants and as many Catholics as possible, demanding government action. These petitions will go to Premier R. L. Borden and to the legislature of British Columbia and Prince Edward Island which control their own marriage laws. The alliance will also ask the Ontario government to send a stated case to its court of appeal to determine the control of the province over marriage.

The object of the meeting is the endorsement of the demonstration farm work carried on by the Department of Agriculture of the United States in different States of the Union and the discussion of promoting scientific methods and far reaching improvements in farming in this State. In view of the fact that Illinois is one of the leading agricultural States of the Union, the subjects to be discussed by the banker-farmers at this gathering are of the greatest importance to the commonwealth.

SHABBY TREATMENT
FOR YORK COUNTY

To the Editor of The Daily Mail:
 Sir.—Assuming that Premier Borden has definitely decided to give Mr. J. D. Hazen a seat in his cabinet, as the representative of New Brunswick, I desire to enter a protest against this uncalled for and unjustifiable action.

When parliament was dissolved and the election called on, Mr. Hazen was given an opportunity and was expected to enter the contest, as the provincial leader of his party and, if possible, win a seat in the Commons; but he positively declined to take the risk, assigning as a reason that he desired to see the Valley Railway project completed before leaving the local arena.

Now that the battle is fought, and the victory won, he permits himself to be used as an instrument in thwarting the ambition of Mr. Geo. W. Fowler and Mr. O. S. Crockett, and turning down the just claims of Kings-Albert or York.

It may be truthfully stated that he has no larger or better qualifications for a Dominion portfolio than either of these gentlemen, unless indeed, he has it in physical appearance, and the features that are said to recommend him to Ottawa "society."

Mr. Fowler may, in the opinion of Mr. Borden, because of his unsavory reputation arising out of the Foresters' investigation, be said to be an impossibility, but Mr. Crockett is not open to any such aspersion, and, in the opinion of his friends, has ability equal to Mr. Hazen and although he may not compare favorably with him in blandness and suavity of demeanor, he can talk just as well as the gentleman who has been distinguished in New Brunswick for his "boiled saw-dust" speeches.

But apart from the personal element, surely some consideration is due to the constituency of York County. Whether right or wrong, the electors of this county have expressed their approval of Mr. Crockett and their support of Mr. Borden's negative policy.

Why should York now be overlooked in order that a St. John man, with no better claims should be placed over our heads?

It is difficult to understand what secret influences have been brought to bear on Mr. Borden in the selection of Mr. Hazen. Time may tell.

But it will be a greater insult still if the constituency is to be placed in the market, and a "safe" seat found for the new minister, here. If the rumor is correct that Mr. Crockett is to accept a personal office which will vacate the representation of the county, this will be part of the deal and a further blow will be given to grand old York. We have apparently fallen on evil days.

It is to be hoped that such a result may be averted and that the county will yet get a measure of

FAIR PLAY.

FORTIETH ANNIVERSARY
OF CHICAGO FIRE

Chicago Oct. 9—The fortieth anniversary of the Chicago fire was observed today not only in this city and State but in many other States of the Union, where the respective governors set aside the day under the appellation of "fire prevention day" to be observed in the interest of the inter-State movement of reducing the enormous losses by fire sustained annually throughout the country. In compliance with the agreement reached by the governors of various States at their conferences a short time ago Governor Deneen had issued the proclamation setting aside the anniversary day of the great fire as "fire prevention day" and had asked the citizens to co-operate in the interest of the movement for the reduction of losses by fire. Last year the property loss by fire in the United States was \$234,470,650 of which Illinois bore its share of about \$11,000,000. Between 1901 and 1910 the per capita loss to every man, woman and child in the United States was \$2.71 for this fire waste, while in Europe the loss was only 33 cents per head and in Germany the per capita loss was only 19 cents.

The special features of today's observance of the day were an exhibition arranged by the Chicago Historical Society to illustrate the great Chicago fire of 1871 and the various phases of Chicago's civic development and a general cleaning up of back yards, cellars, attics and other places where combustible material is usually accumulated.
