WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homstead a quarter section of available Dominon land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must pear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by broxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or ister of intending homesteader.

Duties-Six months' residence upon of three years. A homesteader may ive within nine miles of his homatead on a farm of at least eighty cres, solely owned and occupied by im or by his father, mother, son, laughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his hometead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn omestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain disricts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties, -Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fft- acres and erect a house worth \$300.00. W. W. CORY.
