





Reciprocity has now passed at Washington. Whether it becomes law or not rests with the Canadian Parliament and people. It is worth recalling the terms of the agreement and pointing out in a general way its meeting to the two countries affected. The bill is a tariff amendment, divided into three scheduled, embodying a large free list on natural products, and reduced duties on food products and ceriain manufactures.

For farmers there will be distinct advantage in free access to the United States market for the following, among other articles, upon which duty is now levied :-
