## Eighteen New Cardinals Appointed at Rome Today

**Secret Consistory Held this Morning—His Holiness Pope Pius X Showed Signs of Increasing Feebleness—Public Consistory will be held Thursday in Hall of Beatification—One Cardinal Created "In Pectore"**

Rome, Nov. 27.—Obedient to summons from Pope Pius X, the cardinals of Rome assembled in a secret consistory today, and confirmed the papal nomination of 18 new members in the college of Cardinals, the supreme governing body of the Roman Catholic Church.  
As he entered the hall of the consistory, where today's ceremony took place, his step was less sure and the careworn face of His Holiness bore signs of his recent illness that had come to stay. Nevertheless, he withstood the fatigue of the long and trying ordeal bravely, with a smile for each and a word for several in the long procession that passed before the papal throne.

**PUBLIC CONSISTORY**  
In accordance with the ecclesiastical law, a public consistory must be held three days after the private gathering, where the cardinals with the exception of those from Spain and Austria will receive their red hats. The Spanish and Austrian prelates as is provided in the concordat with those countries, must receive the biretta first from the hands of the temporal sovereign. The public consistory will be held on Thursday in the Hall of the Beatification instead of the Sala Regia as at first planned. Today's ceremony comparatively simple, was carried out with a stately dignity and form that has characterized the institution from the earliest days. The consistory was set for 9 o'clock and early in the day great crowds gathered in the piazza of St. Peter's and around the Basilica to witness the arrival of the cardinals and other dignitaries. Soon after 8 o'clock, a procession of carriages was entering the Porte Dela passing through the court of San Damae from where their occupants found entrance to the palace.

**POPE'S ALLOCATION.**  
The Pope, following the ceremony, delivered a brief allocation, beginning by saying that the present year is a year of mourning for the church. All felt that this phrase alluded to the dangerous commemoration of the Italian jubilee, which, it is felt, offended the rights of the Holy See, through the manifestations of sectarians, evidently hinting at the Free Masons' hatred to the Catholic faith, the allocation continues, was promoted this evening the faithful of the whole world, while the supreme greatness of Italy is this faith which has inspired every civil progress and which alone is the source of peace and lasting prosperity. The Pope lamented the impurity which was granted to the enemies of religion in Rome, especially the iniquitous body, as he refers to them, which opposed the existence of God and the Christian order.

**SITUATION IN PORTUGAL.**  
Pius X then dealt with the persecution of the church in Portugal by the same body and expressed the hope that the Portuguese nation boasting of the centuries of attachment to the church, would react her enmity.  
The evils of modernism and naturalism were counterbalanced, the Pope continued, everywhere by the love of the Holy Eucharist as was proved by the congresses in Cologne, London, Montreal and Madrid. Spain especially had, he said, demonstrated her true religious sentiment and he ended with the hope that God would preserve her from the evil threatening her peace and happiness. The

Berlin, Nov. 27.—The German cruiser Berlin and the gunboat Eber have been recalled from Agadir in Morocco, where they have been stationed since the departure of the gunboat Panther in July of this year. This puts an end to the critical situation created by the sending of the gunboat Panther to that port on July 1st of this year by the German government, in order to make a demonstration in favor of German interests.

Ottawa, Nov. 26.—Official announcement is made tonight of the personnel of the new Canadian section of the International Waterways Commission. As already announced, they are T. Chase Casgrain, K.C., of Montreal; C. A. Magrath, ex-M.P., of Lethbridge, and H. A. Powell, K.C., of St. John. This is a very strong commission.  
Mr. H. A. Powell has high standing at the bar in New Brunswick and has a wide knowledge of the industrial life of his province. The appointment is in line with the choice of Major Leonard to be chairman of the Transcontinental Commission.  
Mr. Casgrain is one of the most eminent jurists of Quebec and a man of high character and attainments. Mr. Magrath, during his period of service in the House, made a deep impression alike on the House and the country as a singularly able man with a fresh and original outlook and much strength of character.

### TRADE WITH U.S. DECREASES

Washington, D.C., Nov. 27.—The United States trade with foreign countries has grown considerably this year compared with that of a year ago, according to statistics of the department of Commerce and Labor, issued yesterday. The export trade for the ten months ending with October, increased \$235,000,000 over the period last year, while the imports decreased \$32,000,000 in the same time. A balance of trade in favor of the United States, amounting to \$401,500,000 existed on November 1st. Canada's exports to this country for October decreased \$1,200,000 from October of last year and \$6,300,000 for the ten months ending with October. American exports to Canada increased \$6,500,000 for October and \$48,600,000 for the ten months.
