

The country was beginning to see that the farmer should not be held responsible entirely for the condition of the rural roads. There was no tax or road improvement, however small or large, that did not bring some enefit to every man, woman and child in the city as well as in the country, because good roads over which traffic could travel easily meant cheaper food, closer relationnap between country and town, beter health and an elevation of agriculture in the minds of the people
