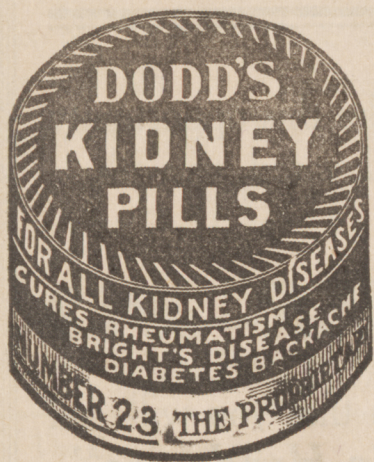

Toronto, Ont., Dec. 30—With more than one-half of the municipalities of Ontario already "dry" the prohibition forces are hopeful of a considerable increase to the list as the result of the elections to be held next Monday. Of the 244 municipalities where local option campaigns were possible this year contests have been brought in about one-third. Port Arthur, Port William and Chatham are the most important places in which a vote will be taken on the license question.
