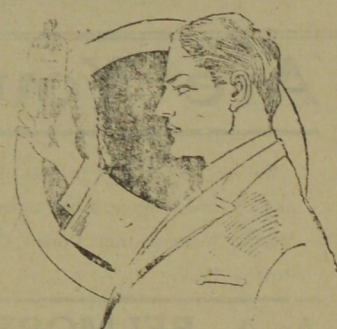

If Spratt must undergo an operation—with Bridwell not yet fully recovered from the blood poisoning in his foot—it would seriously handicap the Braves, although Arthur Devlin played shortstop for the Giants a good deal in 1907 and 1908.
