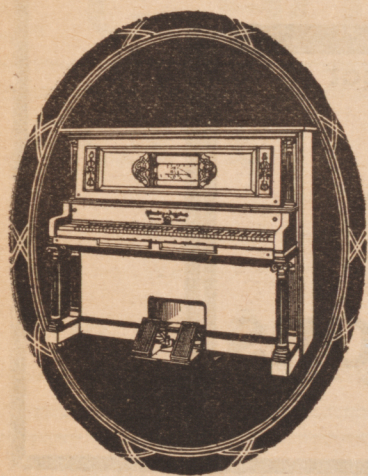

RIO & MEXICAN MAY RAISE DIVIDEND

Toronto, Feb. 16—An important announcement is expected shortly from insiders as regards Rio, or Mexican Light and Power intentions, with reference to an early increase in dividend rates.

Those who claim to be close to the management express the opinion that Rio will pay at 7 per cent. rate early in April and the Mexican Power is likely to go on a 6 per cent. basis.

It is calculated that at the present rate of revenue the power Company is earning close to 30 per cent. (Canadian money) and that it is well able to deal more liberally with its shareholders.

Financiers and brokers here expect some definite statement shortly regarding both these companies from Sir William Mackenzie.

ENGLAND ASTONISHED AT REDMOND'S SPEECH

London, Ont., Feb. 16—All England is discussing John Redmond's Home Rule speech in Ireland, in which, for the first time in the history of the Irish leader has publicly proclaimed his willingness to accept local self-government as a full measure of Irish demands and to acknowledge England's King as ruler of Ireland.

Hitherto the Nationalists have consented to accept whatever England granted as a step toward final separation, but the Irish leader yesterday, in endorsing the Prime Minister's statement of the measure of Home Rule to be granted, astonished all his hearers by applauding the autonomy granted to South Africa by King Edward and expressing the hope that King George would open the Irish Parliament and so hasten the day when Ireland, reconciled, would become a loyal unit of the British Empire. His speech was hailed with joy by the government leaders and Liberal newspapers.

WANT PARTICULARS IN RUSSELL'S SUIT

Montreal, Feb. 17.—Affidavits were filed today in the \$200,000 action of David Russell against the Pinkerton Detective Agency by W. A. McNamara, their local superintendent, and Kenneth R. MacPherson, K.C., setting forth that the particulars demanded in their recent motion for further particulars of Mr. Russell's claim were essential to the making of a proper defence. This was demanded by Mr. Russell's counsel, when the motion came up at a previous hearing before Justice Weir, when the delibere was discharged and time granted for filing the affidavits.

It was expected that the argument on these affidavits would have been heard by Justice Guerin in the practice court this afternoon, but so much time was occupied by the argument in the Lanctot case that it had to be adjourned and the argument will be heard either tomorrow morning or on Monday.

MAINE TO VOTE ON PROHIBITION

Augusta, Me. Feb. 16—Whether the prohibition of the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquor shall continue under the construction of the state of Maine is to be determined by the voters of the state at a special election next September. By a vote of 105 to 40 the house of representatives today passed the senate resolution re-submitting to popular vote the constitutional prohibitory amendment which was adopted in 1884. The resolution passed the senate on Tuesday last 23 to 7. As both branches have given the measure the necessary two-thirds majority all that remains is the signature of Governor Ziaistad, who was elected by the Democrats last fall on a platform pledging re-submission.

A number of times in the past efforts have been made to have the prohibitory amendment re-submitted and on more than one occasion a majority of the legislature have voted for re-submission, but never before has the necessary two-thirds majority been mustered in both branches.

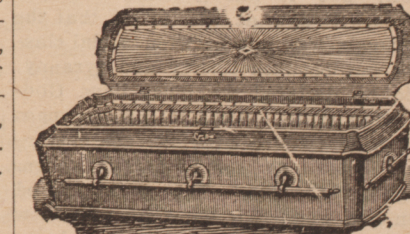

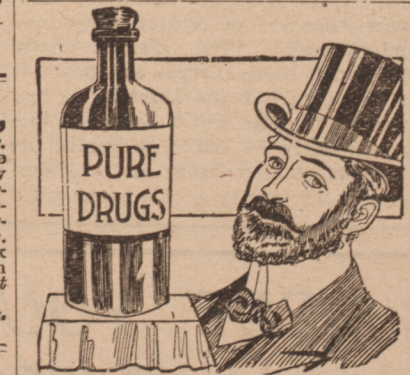
