THE RULES

RULE No. 1.—Any lady over 16 years of age, married or single, who can be vouched for by three reliable citizens, if desired, is eligible to enter the contest from the district in which she lives. She may nominate herself or a friend may place her in nomination.

RULE No. 2.—There will be five separate districts from which to enter, described on this page. A coupon will be printed in every issue of The Daily and Semi-Weekly Mail, which, when trimmed neatly and filled in the name and district of the lady to be voted for, and will be good for one vote. Votes will also be given with cash subscriptions to the two papers. To obtain these the subscription must be paid to the home office of the papers at Fredericton, and each subscription coupon must bear a number to correspond with a ledger number on record in this office. No coupons of either kind will be sold for money or other consideration. They will be issued on the payment of each cash subscription to no less than three months. LADIES ARE NOT LIMITED TO THEIR OWN DISTRICTS IN WHICH TO SECURE VOTES, BUT MUST ENTER THE CONTEST FROM THE DISTRICT IN WHICH THEY LIVE.

RULE No. 3.—First publication of names will be made as soon as a suitable number have entered from each district. Voting will commence on Saturday, October 21, and will continue until Saturday, December 2.

RULE No. 4.—Any district that may have only one active candidate will be declared off and said district will be merged with another district and contestant from said district added to the one with which it is merged.

RULE No. 5.—All special coupons must be filed away and be subject to the inspection of contestants and their friends at the end of the contest if desired.

RULE No. 6.—A board of three responsible business men will have exclusive control of the ballot box the last day of the contest and make announcement of the winners.

RULE No. 7.—No employee of The Mail is eligible to enter the contest.

RULE No. 8.—Contestants can only enter from districts in which they live.

RULE No. 9.—Votes are not transferable from one contestant to another.

RULE No. 10.—In case of a tie in any of the districts named, the two contestants tying for the trip will be sent.

RULE No. 11.—The contest will close at 10 p.m. Saturday, December 2, 1911.

RULE No. 12.—The contest manager reserves the right to pass final judgment upon any question that may arise not covered by the foregoing rules.
