A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eight; acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son. daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted tain a pre-emption, may enter for b purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate erect a house worth \$300.00.
