**SCHOOL TEACHER  
ROBBED AND  
MURDERED**

Huntington, March 11.—With two bullet holes through his head, the mangled body of John F. Bowen, a Wayne County school teacher was found on the Norfolk and Western Railway tracks at Scrum, Wayne County. Every indication pointed to robbery and murder and a few hours after the finding of the body, John D. Maynard of Kermil, was arrested and charged with murder. Bowen had been to Wayne to have several orders amounting to more than \$500 cashed. No money was found on the body.

**MOVING PICTURE SHOWS  
ON THE INCREASE**

Toronto, Ont., March 11.—During the twelve months, it is estimated that from one hundred to one hundred and fifty new moving picture theatres have come into existence in Canada. There are in the Dominion at present about six hundred picture theatres, representing an investment of over \$1,500,000. The tendency during the past year has been to construct a more substantial kind of house, and the improvement in the furnishings and the quality of the shows has been noticeable.
