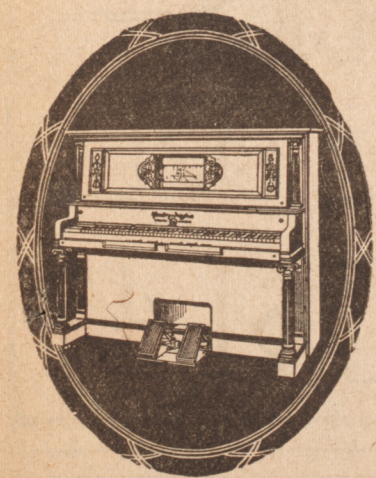

## TO PROHIBIT CARRYING OF DANGEROUS WEAPONS

Toronto, Ont., Mar. 11.—The carrying and sale of firearms, air-guns, knuckles dusters, sandbags, and other dangerous weapons, is to be prohibited in Ontario. Hon. J. J. Foy, Attorney General, introduced a bill to that effect in the legislature yesterday afternoon.

Exception is made for certain cases such as the military and persons to whom permits have been granted by police magistrates.

## PLATINUM MORE COSTLY THAN GOLD

New York, N. Y., March 11.—Platinum which is now far more costly than gold, has been advancing rapidly in price in the last few weeks. It is quoted in Maiden Lane at \$43 an ounce for the hard platinum and \$41 an ounce for the soft metal. These are the highest prices ever reported and indicate an advance of about \$10 an ounce in the last six months.

## RECIPROCITY PACT AND BRITISH PREFERENCE

(Halifax Chronicle)

In his speech on the reciprocity agreement in the House of Commons Mr. F. B. Carvell exposed the insincerity and hypocrisy of the Opposition clamor about the destruction of the British Preference. The Opposition's concern for the maintenance of the Preference is obviously manufactured for the present occasion. The record is proof of their insincerity. From the day on which the preference was first proposed the Conservative Party have never ceased to curse it. They could see no manner of good in it. They protested that it was of no value either to Canada or Great Britain, and they prophesied ruin and disaster for Canadian industries because of the competition of British manufacturers. Now they are shouting for it simply because they have nothing else to shout about, in the hope that they may swing the Imperialist sentiment of the country to their side. But they ignore the fact that while this feature of the Liberal policy gave the Mother Country a substantial advantage in our markets, it was primarily a measure of relief to Canadian taxpayers. As such it was fiercely attacked by the Opposition and the protected interests for whom they speak.

Now that the Opposition are professing so much affection for the British Preference, Mr. Carvell would like to see the Government put the Conservatives and the manufacturers to the test by increasing the British Preference to forty per cent. The Conservatives, he said, would not cheer that announcement; they would not support it because their manufacturing friends would not let them. There would not be a Conservative voice raised for it from Mr. R. L. Borden down to Mr. Crockett. Nothing is more certain than this. The Opposition and their friends would be as violent in their denunciations of an increase in the Preference as they are of reciprocity. Their loyalty is of the mouth, not of the heart.

Mr. Carvell expressed the opinion that Mr. Fielding in concluding the agreement had been too considerate of the manufacturers and the result was a campaign against the agreement and the Government, by the manufacturers and their friends, the bankers. They had not been touched by the agreement but their case had been given away by Mr. H. B. Ames who had said that the agreement stormed the outworks of protection and the citadel was bound to fall.

The reciprocity agreement does not touch adversely a single Canadian industry. It offers to Canadian producers everywhere a new market without affecting their hold upon the old markets. It is primarily a measure for the benefit of the masses of the people. Whatever the outcome may be, and we doubt not that the agreement will be consummated, the debate in Parliament and the discussion in the press have proved that the Tory Party is lined up with the tariff beneficiaries and the "interests" that fatten upon tariff favors against the interests of the people. The Government has done a great stroke for the Liberal Party by showing that it has kept the faith and is true to the traditions of Liberalism. It has inspired all genuine friends of the cause for which it stands with new hope and fresh courage. It has demonstrated the essential difference between Liberalism and Toryism.
