AN ORDER PLACED FOR MAMMOTH LINER

London, Dec. 9.—Another 1,000 foot liner is projected and this time by Germany. It is stated by 'The Standard' that the Hamburg-American line has placed an order with Harland and Wolff for a new steamship which will eclipse in size and magnificence, the White Star giants, 'Titanic' and 'Olympic'. The new vessel will be an enormous floating palace built to carry 5,000 passengers, and will have engines of 80,000 horse power, that is exactly twice as powerful as those of the new White Star liners.

NEWS FORECAST FOR THE COMING WEEK

Washington, D.C., Dec. 9.—The attention of the world will be centered Tuesday on the far-off City of Delhi, where the Durbar ceremony will be held and where—100,000 persons, including many jewel-bedecked princes and potentates, will assemble to see the King and Queen and to hear King George proclaimed Emperor of India.

The event of the week in American politics will be the meeting of the Republican national committee to fix the time and place for holding the national convention and possibly to discuss the vexing question of presidential primaries. The committee will be held by President Taft Monday evening and will hold their meeting the following day. The general expectation is that Chicago will be selected as the convention city, though St. Louis also will put in a strong bid for the gathering.

A special meeting of the National Baseball Commission and the regular annual meeting of the National and American Leagues and several minor organizations will be held in New York during the week and will doubtless furnish "winter fodder" for the restless fans.

A number of important conventions are scheduled for the week, among them the meetings of the American National Live Stock Association, in Denver; the National Wool Growers' Association, in Omaha; the American Civic Association, in Washington; the National Council of Jewish Women, in Philadelphia, and the Canadian Public Health Association, in Montreal. A national congress of business men has been called to meet in Chicago "to consider what is the matter with the country and what remedial legislation will be asked of Congress."

Other events that will contribute to the news of the week will be the election of national officers of the United Mine Workers of America, the first state election in Arizona and the provincial elections in Ontario, the Northwestern Land Products Show in St. Paul, the inauguration of Governor McCreary of Kentucky, and the visit to Montreal of Their Royal Highnesses, the Governor General and the Duchess of Connaught.

BORDEN'S HUMBUGGING POLICY ON THE NAVAL QUESTION

(Montreal Herald)

As long as they keep up the pretence of being opposed to each other on the navy issue, it may be difficult to gauge what the two wings of the Borden Cabinet will do about the navy. But it must be said that the events of the last week made it look more and more like a pretence, in that case we may expect that before very long the two wings will draw in upon the centre, and that both Mr. Rogers and Mr. Monk will stand with Mr. Foster, and Mr. Borden on the solid ground these gentlemen occupied in the spring and summer of 1909. When even Mr. Bourassa scoffs, as he does, at the idea of their being anything unprincipled about the unexplained presence of the two, or three factions in the same Cabinet, we may make an end of looking for the disturbing action of contrary principles in the further dealing with the problem. Laurier being beaten, the navy will presently cease to be an issue. That will take us in almost so many words.

As Mr. Murphy made clear by producing extracts from the Canada Gazette, the naval service goes right on under this Cabinet even if they have different ideas about the kind of ships to build and have cancelled the present tenders. Mr. Hazen says they are going to consult the admiralty about what to do. Mr. White says the same. Mr. Monk says Mr. Borden is about to ascertain what sort of ships better than cruisers which type Mr. Monk himself condemns Mr. Hazen will see the Admiralty in Mr. Monk's name, and Mr. Pelletier's, as well as his own and Mr. Borden's. And it is dollars to doughnuts that what is settled upon will not be contributions in cash, not amendments of Canadian efforts to British control, not the postponement of all efforts until Great Britain abandons what Mr. Aquilino calls her 'indivisible sovereign authority, but will be some variant of a Canadian naval service with its roots in Canadian soil and its control in the Canadian Parliament.

Of course, if proceeding as they are proceeding, it is simple humbug for the ex-Nationalist ministers who now avowing themselves Conserva-

tives, take part in all this, to keep up the delusion about a referendum. A referendum before going to the Admiralty is conceivable. A referendum after they come back is pure effrontery.

Those who, for their own purposes used the Nationalist influence, have got what they sought. Those who, if there were any, were in earnest and were used, have been successfully eliminated. The smile is on the face of the tiger.

NOTED SCULPTOR HAS PASSED AWAY

London, Dec. 9.—Alphonse Legros, the painter, sculptor and etcher, died yesterday. He was born at Dijon, France, in 1837, but migrated to England and became a British subject. Among his best known paintings are "Stoning of St. Stephen," which gained him the gold medal at the Salon in 1867, and "Amende Honorable," a medal picture at the salon the year after.

JEWISH WOMEN IN COUNCIL

Philadelphia, Dec. 11.—Papers dealing with all phases of philanthropic, religious, educational and social work will be read before the National Council of Jewish Women, which holds its triennial sessions at the Hotel Walton this week. This council is one of the largest and strongest of the women's organizations in the country and will have among those participating delegates from all parts of the country many of them of national reputation.
