St. Louis, Mo., Aug. 3.—A confer-
ence of attorneys general from ten
states is to be held in this city to-
morrow for the discussion of the
two-cent fare dispute and other
pending railroad rate litigation. The
states to be represented are Oregon,
Kentucky, South Dakota, Arkansas,
Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma,
Minnesota and Missouri.DOCK WORKERS STRIKE
MAY BE SETTLEDLondon, Aug. 4.—An arbitrator has
been appointed in the dock
workers strike and there are
strong hopes that the troubles be-
tween the workers and employers
will soon be settled.CANADA'S
FIRE LOSSES
WERE HEAVYToronto, Ont., Aug. 4.—According
to the estimate of The Monetary
Times, the fire losses in Canada for
the month of July amounted to \$5,-
334,300, as compared with \$1,151,150
for June and \$6,384,674 for the cor-
responding period last year. Forest
fires contributed very materially to
the list of losses in Northern Ontar-
io, occasioned by the forest fires in
July being conservatively estimated
at \$1,250,000, while at Squamish, B. C.,
forest fires did damage of \$500,-
000. Fire in the lumber yards at
Aymer, Que., did damage estimated
at \$55,000, and at Sarnia of \$205,000
Eganville, Ont., suffered.MR. HAULTAIN'S POSITION
ON RECIPROCITY ISSUEThe Winnipeg Tribune editorially
says:
"When the Conservative convention
was held in Saskatchewan a few days
ago it was noted that the name of
the leader of the party in that Pro-
vince did not appear in the list of
office-bearers. There were those who
intimated that Mr. Haultain had
been turned down. It now transpires
that Mr. Haultain declined the office
of Honorary Vice President of the
Conservative Association of Saskat-
chewan because the convention passed
resolutions endorsing the Borden
platform in regard to reciprocity. Mr.
Haultain took the stand that recip-
rocity would benefit western Canada
and was willing to sink all party
prejudices if in any way he could
with his party strength add some en-
couragement to the agreement. Un-
doubtedly Mr. Haultain's position
is endorsed by thousands of Conserva-
tives who are not of the dyed-in-the
wool variety. The men in both par-
ties worthy of attention are those
who have minds of their own. Mr.
Haultain refuses to be made the mere
cat's paw of any Dominion leader. He
has lived and worked too long in the
independent school to sacrifice his
principles at the bidding of Mr. Bor-
den or any other leader."

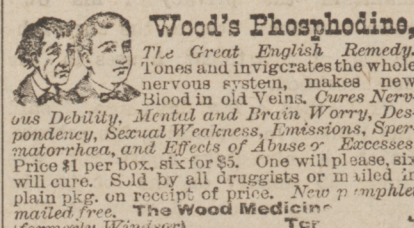
