Wausau, Wis., July 25.—Wages, insurance rates, uniform accounting, the new workmen's compensation law and the general outlook in the lumber trade were among the subjects discussed at the summer meeting of the Northern Hemlock and Hardwood Manufacturers' Association, which met here today.

TEXAS BAPTIST ENCAMPMENT

Lampasas, Texas, July 25.—An imposing religious service marked today the opening of the annual Texas Baptist Encampment at Hancock Park. The encampment will continue three weeks, during which time many noted divines and educators of the Baptist denomination will lead in the addresses and discussions. Tomorrow there will be opened a three days' golden jubilee celebration of Texas Baptist Women.

DAIRY RECORDS

The new extension work of the Dairy Division, Ottawa, is causing many enquiries to be made. For the benefit of our readers it may be explained that officials are now located in Peterboro, Lanark and Oxford counties, Ontario; St. Hyacinthe and Brome, Quebec; and at Kensington, P. E. I., with a view of gathering specific information as to the exact standing of the dairying industry in the district. Each such district is termed a dairy record centre. Each farmer within a certain area will be called on, and there will be obtained from him a statement as to the number of acres cultivated and in pasture, the number of cows, the type of the milk used at home, the cost of feed, and so on. When these statements are compiled there will be definite and valuable information for the encouragement of other dairymen. It is intended to follow up this work closely for some years both in these and in other sections.

The recorders are paying special attention to the encouragement of cow testing in these districts; they are already collecting weights and tests of about four thousand cows, so that it is evident that a tremendous impetus is being given to cow testing by this new forward movement.

A special bulletin on cow testing is available to all applicants. Forms for recording weights of milk are supplied free by the Dairy Commissioner, Ottawa. When applying, state the number of cows, and whether forms are wanted for weighing daily or on only three days each month.

Dallas, Texas, July 25.—A delegation of several hundred representatives of the advertising clubs of Texas leaves this city in a special train tonight for Boston to attend the convention there next week of the National Associated Advertising Clubs of America. Raspberrying is the order of the day.


BELGIAN QUEEN CONGRATULATED
