REVOLUTIONARY MOVEMENT IN CHINA

Hankow, China, Oct. 12.—The revolutionary movement is gaining momentum with every hour. Since noon yesterday it has swept the little city of Han Yang and the native quarter of Hankow. Great numbers of Chinese are joining the movement voluntarily. The losses in the fighting thus far aggregates several hundred, but practically all the dead are Manchus. The slogan of the movement which is guided by shrewd and temperate leaders is evidently "Down with the Manchus."

Thus far there has been no indication of any animosity against foreigners on the part of the revolutionists. A special proclamation, issued by the rebel general in charge of the forces in Hu Peh, states that the penalty for any interference with foreigners or with commerce shall be instant death. The proclamation further declares:

"This is the army of the people. We will overthrow the tyrant Manchu dynasty and revive the rights of the real Chinese. The capture of Han Yang, which is a town of perhaps 100,000, just north of Hankow, has delivered into the hands of the revolutionists the arsenal and the important Han Yang iron works. The revolutionists had no trouble in Han Yang overwhelmingly outnumbering the local troops. General Chang Piao escaped by flight and the members of the local government were dispersed."

The popularity of the revolutionary movement all along the river and in the interior is indicated by apparently authentic reports that several nearby cities have fallen where resistance was offered the rebel forces. The town appears to have been out to the torch.

When the revolutionists swept across the river they followed their previous policy in Wu Chang, avoiding any attack on the foreign concessions. The Methodist missionaries in Wu Chang escaped over the walls and are known to be safe.

IN HONOR OF CARDINAL GIBBONS

Washington, D. C., Oct. 12.—A procession of archbishops, bishops, monsignori and priests of the Roman Catholic Church, clad in their varicolored vestments, formed an impressive prelude to the ceremonies this afternoon at the laying of the cornerstone for the Gibbons Memorial Hall at the Catholic University. The procession across the campus and through the buildings of the University was led by Cardinal Gibbons, who was attended by a large delegation of priests from the Baltimore diocese.

Upon arriving at the new memorial hall, one wing of which is already completed, the corner-stone was laid in the tower section, or central portion of the building. Exercises of a simple but impressive nature attended the laying of the stone. In addition to Cardinal Gibbons the speakers included the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Thomas J. Shahan, rector of the University; the Rev. Dr. Charles F. Aiken, dean of the theological department, and the Rev. Dr. D. W. Shea, dean of the school of science of the University.

The Gibbons Memorial Hall is to be added to the already imposing group of buildings belonging to the Catholic University as a permanent and enduring memorial to the famous Baltimore prelate who has always manifested the keenest interest in the educational work of the Church. The present year, marking as it does the fiftieth anniversary of his elevation to the cardinalate, was selected as the most appropriate time for the construction of the memorial.

The memorial hall, massively constructed of stone, is designed for use as a hall of residence by students of the university. The structure will occupy a commanding site directly across the campus from the administration building of the University. In the rear of the new building is Michigan Avenue, the principal artery

WORLD'S CHAMP GAMES WILL DRAW BIG CROWD

New York, Oct. 12.—An indication of what baseball officials expect when the gates of the Polo Ground are opened on Saturday for the first of the world's series games is furnished by an order which has been sent out to the four hundred employees who will handle the mass of fans. To each man the following notice has been sent:

"It will be necessary for players to report at the polo grounds Oct. 14 at 7:30 o'clock in the morning. Please answer this card and present same at the gate in order to obtain entrance to the grounds."

There has been only a little betting here thus far on the result of the series. The New York Club management has decided to abandon the plan to build a temporary stand in front of the uncovered stands in the outfield. The seating capacity of the permanent stand is nearly forty thousand and the early application for seats indicate that this will be almost sufficient, with the addition of available standing room accommodating five thousand. It has been decided that the playing field shall not be invaded except by players and umpires. Four umpires have been assigned to officiate in the series, two from each minor league. When all four are to be used, two of them will be stationed in the outfield to decide when balls have been batted among the fringe of spectators, restricting the number of bases the batsmen may take, while the other two umpires decide the bases and balls and strikes. The four umpires will not be needed in any of the New York games, unless to place one at each end of the field. Outfielder DeBoutte of the Chicago National League Club, and Ty Cobb of the Detroit American League team, won the automobiles offered this year for the player in each league who was adjudged by a "jury" of newspaper men to have been of most service to his club in 1911, it was announced today.
