MONTREAL TORIES ARE DIS- PLEASED WITH CABINET

One Report has it that Borden came with in an Ace of Throwing up the Job in Disgust--Sir Hugh Graham is Feeling Sore Because his Recommendations Were Ignored

(Montreal Herald)

It is not putting it too strongly to say that there was extreme disappointment among Montreal Conservatives today over the personnel of the new Borden cabinet. St. James and St. Francis Xavier Streets buzzed with uncomplimentary remarks and with gossip regarding the incidents surrounding the creation of the Cabinet. It was openly stated by Conservatives who are in the swim that the difficulties that confronted Mr. Borden were so serious that as late as Friday night he was disposed to advise the Governor-General that it was not in his power to form a Cabinet.

There was undoubtedly an extraordinary amount of pressure brought to bear upon Mr. Borden from all sides and probably one of the most difficult situations he had to face was in this province. So fiercely did the contentions wage in Montreal that as late as four o'clock last night it was understood that Mr. Borden was coming to this City to discuss the situation with his followers. Later in the evening he appears to have changed his mind, thrown overboard some of the more insistent of his advisers, wrote out his slate and practically said to the party, "take it or leave it."

SIR HUGH DISPLEASED

The quid nuncs say that Sir Hugh Graham was one of the men whose recommendations had to go to the wall and that he came back to Montreal a very much disgruntled man. As a result an article severely criticising the new Cabinet is said to have been prepared for yesterday's Star, but through the intervention of Mr. Borden's friends was not published. However, this may be, Sir Hugh's protegee, Mr. Marchal was not given a portfolio and Mr. Pelletier whom he opposed has been taken into the Cabinet. However, Sir Hugh is credited with having secured the promise of the reversion of the High Commissioner'ship so his work will not go entirely without recognition.

Montreal English-speaking Conservatives are not at all satisfied with the absence from the cabinet of a representative of the Montreal English speaking interests. They evidently feel that Mr. Ames should have got a portfolio as a representative of those interests. They also point out that Ontario with a population of about two millions and a half secured six Cabinet positions and practically a seventh inasmuch as Mr. Perley is an Ontario man. From the Ottawa river to the Atlantic there are probably over three millions of people, yet they have but six representatives.

STRONG MEN OMITTED

As regards the personnel of the Cabinet it is pointed out by the Conservatives who are taking umbrage at its composition that many of the strongest men in the party have been omitted from the list. They say, "Where are McBride, Whitney, Roblin, Tupper, Casgrain, Sproule, McInnis Ames, McLean Bennett, and Broder?" These are all names well known throughout the Dominion, yet their places are taken by men who are probably well meaning and public spirited have not developed any particular aptitude for public life in the heart. Of those thus characterized

may be mentioned Messrs Reid, Burrell, Crothers, Nantel, and Roche. To add to the discomfiture of the local Conservatives we have the fact that Mr. Borden's first Lieutenant, Mr. W. T. White, is not known to politics, has never had any parliamentary experience, and has absolutely no wia his spurs as a public man.

In addition to these objections all of which were heard on the streets and in the offices of Montreal today, is another one which naturally is strongly felt by several groups of prominent Conservatives it is the objection voiced by our Ottawa correspondent today that the Cabinet will be in the main friendly to the Canadian Northern Railway and to the Bank of Commerce interests. In other words as one prominent Conservative put it, Toronto appears to have captured what Montreal long held.

A QUEBEC FARMER CHARGED WITH MURDER

Ottawa, Oct. 13—Felix Drouin, farmer of Boileau, Ponsby Township Quebec, is under arrest for the alleged murder of an unknown man on Monday last. The complaint is laid by a woman neighbor, who swears to having seen him fire five shots at a man who fell and was dragged away.

Sheriff Wright of Hull and Detective McKaskill of Montreal made the arrest without resistance, but no trace of any body could be found.

STUDENTS BUILDING CAMP

The students of the engineering and forestry departments of the University of New Brunswick have under the direction of Professors McInnes and Miller begun the erection of a camp which is to be used in connection with their work. The camp is located near the Forest Hill road but is approached from College Road. A party of students will go out tomorrow to continue work on it.

MISS BORDEN MARRIED

Elizabeth, elder daughter of Sir Frederick Borden, formerly Minister of Militia, was married at the residence of her parents in Canning, Wednesday forenoon, to Gordon Hewitt, of the Department of Agriculture, Ottawa. Bunting was displayed in Canning in honor of the event and the residence of Sir Frederick was prettily decorated. Rev. A. Hockin, Methodist minister in Canning, read the marriage service, and was assisted in the ceremony by Rev. William Ainley, of Bridgewater, an old friend of the Borden family. The little daughter of Mrs. Macoun, of Ottawa, niece of the bride, was flower girl. After luncheon, Mr. and Mrs. Hewitt left for a honeymoon trip which began with an automobile tour of the western portion of Nova Scotia. The presents were numerous and handsome.

SORE ON BORDEN

Under the heading The Toronto Telegram, the ultramarine shades of whos! Toryism no one can question, published the following editorial referred yesterday to the two leading Ontario members of the Borden Government:—

"If Hon. R. L. Borden and the Borden Government have any real friends in Ontario, those friends will set to work and defeat Hon. Frank Cochrane and Hon. W. T. White in any constituency to which they may appeal in this province."

"The question for Ontario Conservatives to decide is whether they will strangle the advisers who have subordinated the R. L. Borden Premiership to clericalism and corporatism on the occasion of the first betrayal of the people."

"Or will the true friends of the Borden Premiership hesitate to strangle the worst enemies of that Premiership and give these enemies time to strangle the whole Conservative party and deprive Canada of the fruits of as noble a victory as a free people ever won?"

"The defeat of Hon. Frank Cochrane and Hon. W. T. White in Ontario constituencies would bring Hon. R. L. Borden face to face with the quality of which he has accepted as wisdom, and teach Mr. Borden that the voice of Ontario does not necessarily speak in the accents of Sir William MacKenzie J. W. Flavell & Company."

The Telegram's anger is at white heat now, but it will not last before long it will be chattering for Nantel and the tricolor, as Jean Prevost did when he denounced Laurier and the Canadian navy.

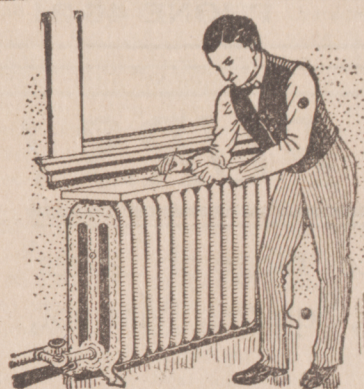

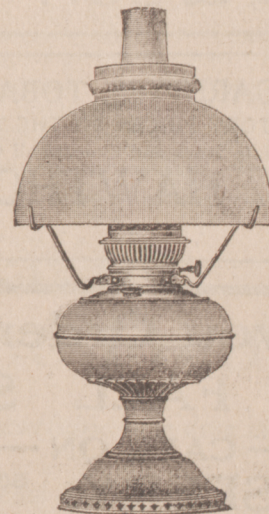
