## J. M. ROBINSON & SONS WEEKLY STOCK MARKET REVIEW

St. John, Oct. 14—This weeks stock market has been broken by the holiday on Thursday, but has nevertheless maintained a very firm tone right through, the principal points of strength being the railroad, particularly those operating through the Southern country where the prospects of a large cotton crop indicate good business during the fall. The exception has been the coal roads notably Reading and Lehigh Valley, where there has been some weakness owing to the Government action.

### MONEY

Money is easy all the world over the situation in Germany being particularly reassuring, it is noted that during the past two weeks the German Financial situation shows a marked improvement and that so far as that country is concerned trouble is practically at an end. In New York funds are easy in spite of the demand for crop moving and the sending of funds to Europe.

### GENERAL CONDITIONS

It is reported from New York that there is a large borrowing demand for stocks particularly in Union Pacific, Steel and Reading but some doubt is cast on the genuineness of this demand as representing any short interest, it is rather indicated that the borrowing demand is from long interests who are protecting by holding back their own certificates and is used for a purpose, whether this surmise is correct or not is impossible to say, it is however interesting.

It is quite evident from the general trend of affairs that while the market may have reached bottom or nearly so, there is still considerable liquidation to take place in general business; it is noted that James J. Hill, predicts a great deal of idleness this winter and it seems entirely probable that there will be a considerable amount of labor laid off during the coming months once this trouble is out of the way however, there will be a long upward swing in both Commercial and Financial business.

### NORFOLK AND WESTERN

The New York Post has the following interesting paragraph on this stock which is more interesting in view of the comparative strength that a number of the railroad stocks have shown since the decline in September.

"Last summer the high price for Norfolk & Western was 110½, the low price in September was 99½, a de-

cline of only 10½ points, which considering the fact that the stock had enjoyed a special advance and been the object to much bullish enthusiasm was a very moderate decline. A year ago the stock was selling around 90. The explanation of its strength, or of the solid sort of buying of which its strength is merely a reflection, is found in the earnings. Though that is thought that is thought to be a barren place to look for explanation anything in the stock market, prices ultimately do find their true relation to earnings. The Norfolk is now doing the largest business in its history. Gross Revenue for July and August increased \$475,376 over earnings for the corresponding month last year. To obtain this increase of gross the cost of producing transportation increased only \$10,648. Maintenance, expenditure, however, increased \$173,531, showing to what use a large part of the surplus earnings devoted. The increase remaining net was \$293,267. In these days of general saving in maintenance and of rising costs of producing transportation, the showing of the Norfolk & Western is peculiar."

### MONTREAL

The Montreal market has been very strong, the principal advances being noted in Shawinigan, Montreal Power and Detroit United, though right through the list there is a strong tone and buoyancy noted. Our Montreal office reports as follows:—

"The market this week has been more active at advancing prices and at all times has shown a good undertone and there has been good buying on every slight reactions. In the more active stocks, the eagerness in the money market no doubt has played some part towards bullish sentiment and higher prices are looked for in the good dividend payers, and believe that the market can be bought on all reactions, for higher prices later on.

### MONTREAL POWER

"This stock has been quite active this week, selling up close to its previous high record of 57½. On the sharp advance there were rumors on the street of a new of new stock issue and increase in dividend, but this stock is probably more easily moved of which could be confirmed, never on account of the diminishing floating supply on the street as on all reactions it is continually being bought for investment. The stock no doubt within a year will be on a 10 p. c. basis, and will then easily sell at 200 consider it a good purchase on all reactions.

## ONTARIO MURDERER IMPRISONED FOR LIFE

Barrie, Ont. Oct. 13—Imprisonment for life was the sentence imposed on Arthur Sheridan by a Justice of the Peace after a trial lasting two days. Sheridan was charged with murder of Ross Ford, the young farmer, who was stabbed to death in a quarrel at a dance near Orillia last July. The jury after four hours, reached a disagreement, eleven favoring the conviction for murder and the twelfth standing for a manslaughter verdict. T. C. Robinson, K. C., counsel of the prisoner, thereupon offered a plea of guilty to a charge of manslaughter, which was accepted by the crown and sentence was imposed.

Sacramento, Cal. Oct. 13—Shortly before noon today President Taft arrived in Sacramento, the first important stop on his California itinerary. Governor Johnson and other prominent representatives of the State were on hand to give him greeting. After an informal reception at the station the distinguished visitor was escorted to the capitol, where he delivered a brief address, to the large crowd assembled there. At 1 o'clock the journey to Oakland and San Francisco was resumed.

## CONSERVATIVES CRITICIZE CHIEF

Sherbrooke, Oct. 11—Conservatives and Liberals alike were surprised when the full make up of the Borden cabinet was learned. What probably was the greatest surprise of all was the calling of Mr. W. B. Nantel to take the portfolio. The most ardent of the Nationalists here were surprised. They looked for Messrs Monk and Pelletier being called, but not Nantel.

One leading Nationalist said to your correspondent that he was afraid that Mr. Borden had made a mistake in calling so many of the Nationalist party around the council board. The straight Conservatives do not hesitate to say that it would probably have been better if Col. Sam Hughes had been given an appointment outside the cabinet and they also expressed disappointment of the exclusion of Mr. Andrew Broder, who had been looked upon as the only fit and proper person to take up the agricultural portfolio.

They also recognized the fact that the Protestant minority has not been fairly treated. While Mr. Geo. Perley may be looked upon as their representative it is felt that Mr. Borden has been driven to overlook their claims for representation in giving the only Protestant from Quebec a seat in the cabinet without portfolio.

The Liberals are pleased at the selection. They point with pride to the strong men of the Liberal party of 1896 and several of whom remained their for fifteen years. The Liberals believe that it will not be long before the different factions, represented in the cabinet, will so assert themselves that it will be impossible to keep them in hand.

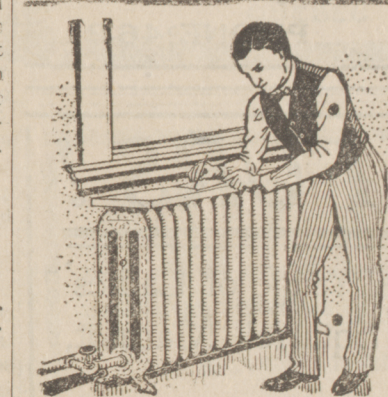

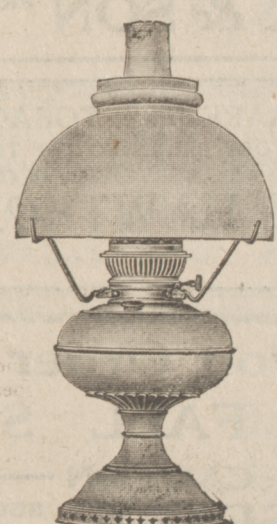
