## HON. MR. FLEMMING'S UNGRACEFUL DESCENT

The Hartland correspondent of the Woodstock Sentinel writes:

A dull thud! At last it begins to look like the valley road is to be a reality, a real up-to-date steam road to be located built and managed along lines similar to those first laid down by the Federal ministers and so strenuously advocated by Messrs. Pugsley and Carvell. After months and months of shilly shallying and dickerings the great C. P. R. Fleming-Hazen scheme has been discarded. In spite of repeated assertions to the contrary the wild cat railway schemes of the local government have one after another been abandoned until at present it would seem that the iron determination of both Hon. Wm. Pugsley and F. B. Carvell to see that the country got just what was needed in the way of a railway, is destined to prevail and that the wholly inadequate and defenseless proposition of Messrs. Hazen and Fleming are to go by the board. The Hon. Prov. Sec. for all he was so positive that his plan and his only would go in this connection has at last been driven to submit to popular opinion and superior judgment. This man is just beginning to realize that the victory won on that memorable March day three short years ago did not constitute an unqualified permit to play fast and loose with the country's best interests. Several times since that day has the Hon. Provincial Secretary sustained a severe shock to his political assumptions in this direction. His first bad break was when he essayed to unload B. F. Smith on Carleton County as a Federal representative. Again he slipped up and fell down when he set out to replace Smith in the local house with a puritanical Hazen supporter. And now comes this last capitulation and general retreat of the Hazen-Fleming combination from a railway policy which the country has been repeatedly assured was the only reasonable proposition, and the one that this government would eventually put through regardless of Federal opposition and independent of Federal aid if necessary. Of course this kind of talk carried no weight! Hon. Wm. Pugsley started out with the avowed determination to protect the credit and best interests of this province in this matter, and the periodical threats and frantic wails of these monopoly controlled electric enthusiasts failed to jar the Federal Min-

## THE GREAT HEAT WAVE

When in Boston Chicago and St. Louis, and in the environs of New York a temperature of 100 degrees is simultaneously recorded; when a Fourth of July that breaks all records for discomfort numbers its score of heat deaths, and when torrid weather for a thousand miles and more inland shows little signs of relief, the heated term has very unusual aspects.

Certainly it is by a singular reversal of normal weather conditions that the "summer capital" on the wind-swept Massachusetts coast is as hot at Yuma, Ariz. In extent and severity the present heated term exceeds any in recent history. Measured in terms of physical discomfort, the cities of the East, because of the humidity have been generally worse off than the sun-baked prairies of the west.

Cold waves customarily descend from Manitoba or other sub-polar centres of incubation. High temperatures on the contrary, develop locally and may develop spontaneously in widely separated regions from conditions favorable to their production. What gives the present heated term its distinctiveness is that the whole country is hot at the same time. Nowhere is there rain to moisten or northern breeze to cool. Give a July sun and such conditions of atmospheric calm, and suffering is certain.

The suddenness and severity of the visitation here served to illustrate anew the extreme variability of the climate in temperate latitudes, the very fluctuations of which baffle meteorological investigation. There is the consolation that extreme temperatures in July commonly mark the crest of midsummer heat and foreshadow a cool August. A question for serious concern as respects the cities reduced water supply and in the light of last summer's drought is whether the present heat forbodes another "dry spell."

The additional draughts on the small reserve of water necessitated by the intense heat make increased caution obligatory in the use of water for any but essential purposes.
