London, June 4—Lord Mersey, the head of the court which is inquiring into the disaster to the White Star liner Titanic, repeated the question whether the witness thought the captain justified in his action, adding:

"At either day or night."

Ismay replied in the affirmative. Ismay was the star witness when the investigation was resumed today. He told the court that the chief engineer had arranged before the steamer left Queenstown for New York that the weather being favorable on either Monday or Tuesday, the vessel would be driven at full speed for a few hours.
