MANITOBA TEACHER

WAS KIDNAPED

Snowflake, Man., Sept. 13.—A fierce man hunt and deadly skirmish resembling Indian warfare has been under way for the past 24 hours ten miles between here and the United States border. This sensational situation is the climax of the kidnapping of a pretty young school teacher Eleanor Gladys Price, by a desperado believed to be Henry Bill Wilson alias Bill Miner of Hannah N.D.

All during the night a force of 300 pursued the fugitive through the bush and many shots were exchanged. At sunrise he was surrounded in a dense wood. Blood hounds picked up the trail five miles from the school house where the rascal captured the girl Monday afternoon. She returned home in a frightful condition last night. The populace in an infuriated state and the score of constables directing the pursuit will be unable to protect the man if he is captured. The United States officials just over the line have sent a posse into Canada from the south.

Parties tendering will be required to accept the fair wages schedule prepared or to be prepared by the Department of Labor, which schedule will form part of the contract.

Contractors are requested to bear in mind that tenders will not be considered, unless made strictly in accordance with the printed forms and in the case of firms, unless there are attached the actual signature, the nature of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the firm.

An accepted bank cheque for the sum of \$40,000.00 made payable to the order of the Minister of Railways and Canals must accompany each tender, which sum will be forfeited if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the work, at the rates stated in the offer submitted.

The cheque thus sent in will be returned to the respective contractors whose tenders are not accepted.

The cheque of the successful tenderer will be held as security or part security, for the due fulfillment of the contract to be entered into.

SKULLED A SKIFF ACROSS THE CHANNEL

Dover, Sept. 13.—The Rev. Mr. Swann skulled a skiff across the English Channel from Dover to Calais yesterday in three hours and fifty minutes. This breaks the record for a performance of this kind.

ARCHBISHOP ALEXANDER HAS PASSED AWAY

Dublin, Sept. 13.—Most Rev. Wm. Alexander, D.D., D.C.L., Oxon, LL.D., Archbishop of Armagh, Primate of all Ireland (Church of Ireland) since 1886, is dead. He was born in 1824. He was the author of a number of works on the scriptures and a number of sermons, such as "What think ye of Christ?" He was also the author of a sacred prize poem in 1864, and in installation ode and theological essays.

HISTORIC COLLEGE HAS BEEN REOPENED

Barstow, Ky., Sept. 13.—Historic St. Joseph's College, once a place of refuge for King Louis Philippe of France, abandoned as a seat of Catholic learning, except for twenty years after the war, was re-opened here last night with impressive ceremonies in which the most Rev. D. Monde Falconio, apostolic delegate, participated. Numerous other Catholic clergy as well as notable laity, also had parts in the exercises.

FOR MISSION WORK IN SOUTH AMERICA

Atlanta, Sept. 13.—Announcement was made here yesterday by Dr. G. C. Campbell Morgan of London, who is delivering a series of sermons in this city, that Dr. John Henry Jewitt of New York, Dr. Long Broughton of this city, Dr. Morgan himself and several English laymen, have formed a new mission organization, which will devote its attention to mission work in Argentina, Peru and Brazil. The headquarters of the organization will be in London.

PRICK OF PIN CAUSED HIS DEATH

New York, Sept. 13.—Joseph Hopkins died today at a Long Island City hospital, from the prick of a pin. While he was working several weeks ago a barrel which he was carrying forced into his leg the point of a pin with which he had pinned together a roll of bills in his pocket. Blood poisoning ensued.

WORKED ON BOARD THE GREAT EASTERN

(Canadian Press.)

Boston, Sept. 11.—William Wickenson, 70 years old, who was the chief electrician of the steamship Great Eastern when she laid the first Atlantic cable, is dead at his home in Revere. He was the inventor of several devices used in connection with ocean cables.

BORDEN TACTICS IN VICTORIA

Edmundston, Sept. 12.—In Victoria-Madawaska, as in some other parts of Canada the Conservatives are attempting to ride two horses, to run with the hare and ride with the hounds.

In Victoria County Cormier, the opposition candidate protests against being called a Nationalist. In Madawaska his agents are distributing Le Devoir by the hundreds, and some other Nationalist literature.

The nature of Cormier's campaign is thoroughly understood here and it is resented by the people of both counties.

TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

"The Government of the two countries having made this agreement from the conviction that, if confirmed by the necessary legislative authorities, it will benefit the people on both sides of the border line, we may reasonably hope and expect that the arrangement if so confirmed, will remain in operation for a considerable period. Only this expectation on the part of both Governments would justify the time and labor that have been employed in the maturing of the proposed measure. Nevertheless, IT IS DISTINCTLY UNDERSTOOD THAT WE DO NOT ATTEMPT TO BIND FOR THE FUTURE THE ACTION OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS OR THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA, BUT THAT EACH OF THOSE AUTHORITIES SHALL BE ABSOLUTELY FREE TO MAKE ANY CHANGE OF TARIFF OR OF ANY OTHER MATTER COVERED BY THE PRESENT ARRANGEMENT THAT MAY BE DEEMED EXPEDIENT. We look for the continuance of the arrangement, not because either party is bound to it, but because of our conviction that the more liberal trade policy thus to be established will be viewed by the people of the United States and Canada as one which will strengthen the friendly relations now happily prevailing and promote the commercial interests of both countries."

A STRIKING COMPARISON

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 40 acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
